Of course for this particular contest the club boundaries can be anywhere on the west coast, so start beating the bushes for big stations, little stations, any stations at all! Let's trounce all challengers! Go team go...Rah, Rah, Rah... and all that stuff. (You guys get going and we'll get up a cheerleading section with a club song too.) Your team captain will get in touch with each of you to get things organized.

1974 ALL ASIA DX TEST

Rules

1. All operating must be done by bonafide club members.
2. All operating must be done from stations located within the club's territorial boundaries. It is not necessary that the station licensee himself be a member of the club.
3. There are eight entry categories: single-operator single-band entries on 160, 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10 meters; single-operator multi-band; and multi-operator multi-band single-transmitter. There is no multi-transmitter entry allowed by the JARL.
4. Scoring:
 - A. The club score will be the aggregate of its individual members' phone and cw scores. Phone and cw will be separate contests for scoring purposes.
 - B. Individual scores will be determined as follows:
 - i) In any given entry category, if one or more stations from either club makes four or more valid QSOs, then the highest scoring station in that category receives 100 points (equal to 100%). All other stations participating in that same entry category receive a number of points equal to that percentage their score is of the winning score.
 - ii) If no station in a given entry category succeeds in making four or more valid QSOs, then each qso made in that category will be worth 25 points.
 - C. A bonus of 10 points additional will be awarded to the highest scoring station in each of the eight entry categories. In the event of tie scores, the bonus will be divided equally.
 - D. Official standings will be determined by the final AA results reported by the JARL.
5. Any disputes, questions, or other things not covered in the above rules will be determined by a committee consisting of the two club presidents and the two club contest chairmen.

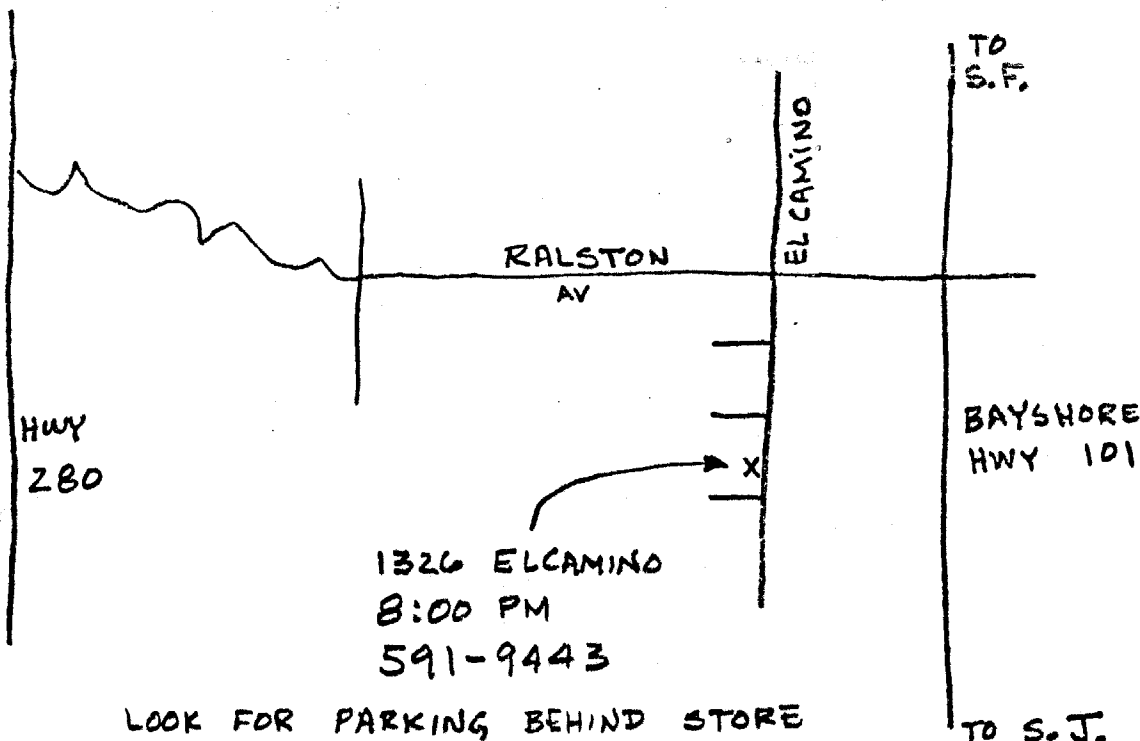

We used these last year in our own intra-club competition and found they worked exceedingly well. The JARL is introducing an AA phone contest for the first time this year, so we suggest the final club score be the aggregate of the individual phone and cw scores. All operating must be done by bonafide club members using either their own or other stations located within the club's territory. Operation within the spirit of the rules is expected, and any disputes will be settled by a committee consisting of the two club presidents and the two club contest chairmen.

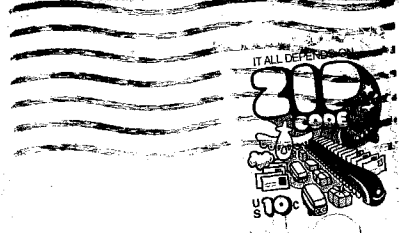
