CONTEST CHAIRMAN'S CORNER

Everyone is invited to participate in the first-ever NCCC-sponsored Maxi-test. A short contest is held after our regular net meeting on Tuesday nights on 3815 KHz. Because of the popularity of these mini-contests, it was decided that a Maxi-test should be held once a month in place of the mini-test. This first one will be a warm-up and a get acquainted event. Contest time is Tuesday night, June 14 (Flag Day), from 8:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. PDT, both phone and CW. Bands will be 160-20 meters, and suggested frequencies are 30 KHz up from the bottom of the band on CW, and 3830, 7230, and 14230 on phone. On 160, look for both phone and CW below 1810. No crossmode or crossband contacts permitted.

The contest exchange will be consecutive QSO number, starting with 001, ARRL section, and your name. Scoring is total QSO's times 5 times the total number of ARRL sections. Sections count only once. In phone, call "CQ MAXI-TEST," and on CW, "CQ MC." Turn in results to WB6LPK/N6TU immediately after the test on 3815, or not later than Tuesday of the following week.

Perhaps the wildest contest to hit the air this year will be the IARU RADIOSPORT CHAMPIONSHIP. It takes place July 9-10 (UTC) and is open to all amateurs. This contest replaces the ARRL Bicentennial and also signifies the coming of WARC-79. Full rules are given in May QST on page 85, but in a nutshell, you can work any amateur station on both phone and CW on 160 through 2 meters. Some very spectacular rates will emerge from this test. The average caliber station should be able to produce well over 100 QPH rates. One may enter CW or phone only as well.

As far as I know, there is no Club Competition for the IARU. Also, entries must be on ARRL IARU log, dupe, and summary sheets to be official. I will order mass quantities, but fear that they will not arrive in time for the June meeting.

Field Day, tally ho! Our FD efforts are all set to go. Blue team, N6VV/6 at Brannan Island; Black team, N6KB/6 at Black Mountain; and Gray team, K6AYA/6 in the Sierras.

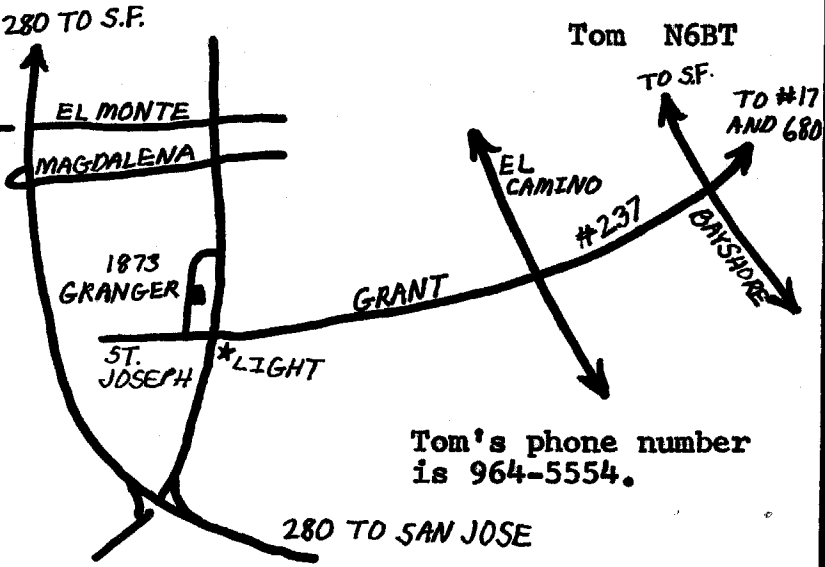

These figures, along with many soap-box comments, prove that the CQP contest has indeed become the NUMBER ONE state QSO Party. Due, of course, in no small part to the efforts of the NCCC.

Looking ahead, work has already begun at planning this year's "California Sweepstakes." Several important rule changes have been made, including the use of recommended county abbreviations. This should be a tremendous help on CW to those of you who live in counties such as Contra Costa, or San Luis bispo, or San Bernardino.

This year we are again making a big effort to get at least one fixed station active in each of our 58 counties. I am taking reservations for the four-county area (Mariposa/Merced/Stanslaus/Tuol-

umne) made famous by W6RNF/6-1975 and WB6FEF/6-1976. Other counties where activity is needed are El Dorado, Mono, Calaveras, Glenn, Modoc, Placer, Plumas, Shasta, Sierra, Siskiyou, Tehama, Tulare, Sutter, and Trinity. Incidentally, WB6RIU/M6 hit almost all of these counties in 1976.

Start thinking about where you'd like to go. If you've ever wondered what it would be like to be rare, here's the only chance you're going to get if your call has a 6 in it.

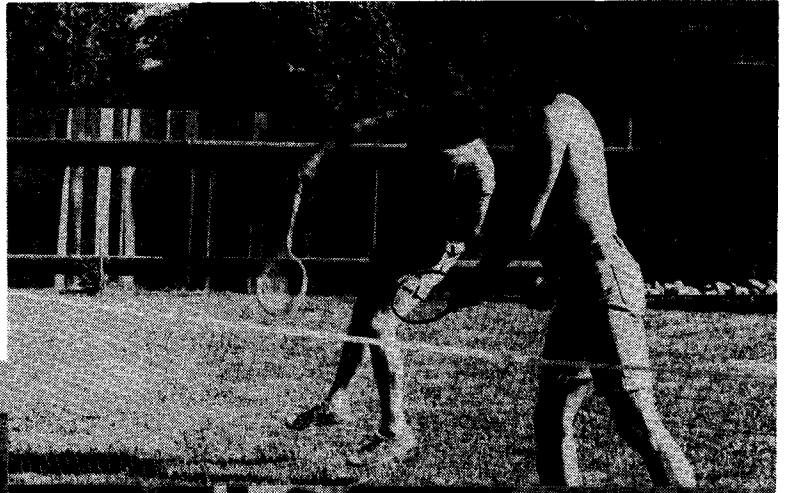
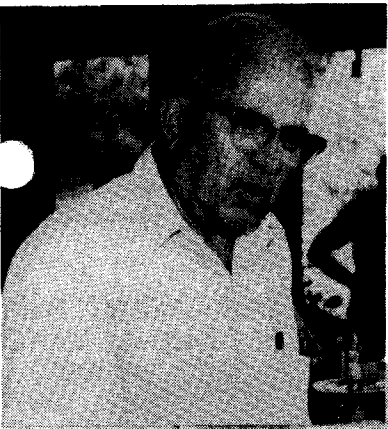
