NCCC WELCOMES NEW MEMBERS!Len Geraldi, K6ANP

Len has been licensed for 31 years and holds the Extra Class License. He is just about to conclude his term as President of the Northern California DX Club. Len has a number of San Francisco section awards from the Sweepstakes and ARRL DX Test, and is the holder of 5-band DXCC and WAZ. Len's operating preference is 80% CW, 20% phone. His station consist of a TS 830, Alpha 76PA, 4 elements on 20, 4 elements on 15, 5 elements on 10, 2 elements on 40, a delta loop on 80 and a Marconi antenna for 160.

Lyle Meek, N6BLN

Lyle has been licensed for 22 years and holds the Extra Class License. Lyle is just concluding his term as Treasurer of the Northern California DX Club and is a member of the Redwood Empire DX Association. Lyle holds DXCC and WAZ. His station consist of a TS 180, SB 220, Telrex 3 element tribander, Hi-Gain high tower and 80 meter delta loop.

Al Higbie, AL7H

Al has been licensed for 24 years and holds the Extra Class License. He placed number 1 for KL7 in the CQWW CW contest for 1980-82. Al prefers CW (90%) to phone (10%).

Doug Bender, WA0JRB

Doug has been licensed for 20 years and holds the Extra Class License. He has won the San Francisco section in the VHF QSO party and is a member of the Redwood Empire DX Association. Doug's station is an Icom 740, SB 200, Cushcraft A-3 tribander and a vertical for 40 and 80. Doug's operating preference is 80% CW, 20% phone.

Dick LeMassena, W6KH

Dick has been licensed for 31 years and holds the Extra Class License. He lists his contest achievements as having been "busted by FCC in CQWW-CW test (November 1966)." Dick is a member of the Northern California DX Club and holds DXCC. His past contest experience includes operations at what is now K6UA.

Bob Dorsey, K4UVT

Bob has been licensed for 25 years and holds the Extra Class License. Bob is a member of the Northern California DX Club and a former member of the Virginia Century Club. Bob has operated at K6ZM's during the 1983

ARRL DX Test and CQWW. Bob won the ARRL CD party in 1963 for Virginia, noting that "W4KFC had company that weekend!" Bob's station consist of a TS 930S, a 5 element Telrex tribander and a vertical for 40 and 80.

Ted Algren, KA6W

Ted has been licensed for 31 years and holds the Extra Class License. He was formerly W0QIE and W6JPD. Ted is about to conclude his term as Contest Chairman of the Northern California DX Club. Ted is one of several who escaped to the mountains to put up a big station. His station consists of a TS 930S and a home-brew amplifier, monobanders on 10, 15 and 20, two 40 meter delta loops, two 80 meter delta loops and a 160 meter delta loop. Having listened to Ted work Europeans that I could barely hear, I know the station works.

Mary Bradshaw, WI6Y

Mary has been licensed 2 years and has already obtained the Extra Class License. Mary splits her operating between phone and CW. Her station is a TS 930S and a KT 34A. NCCC extends a warm welcome to each of our new members.

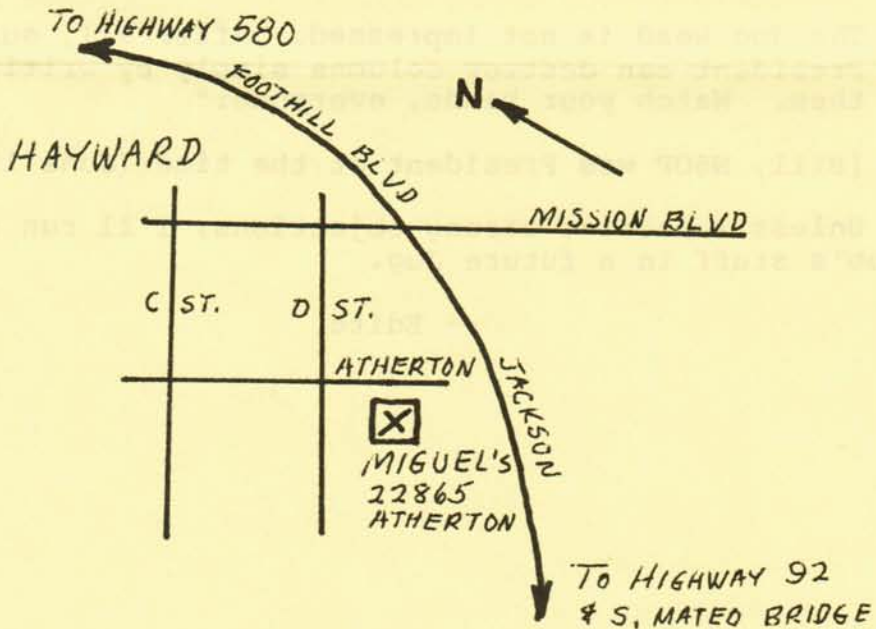

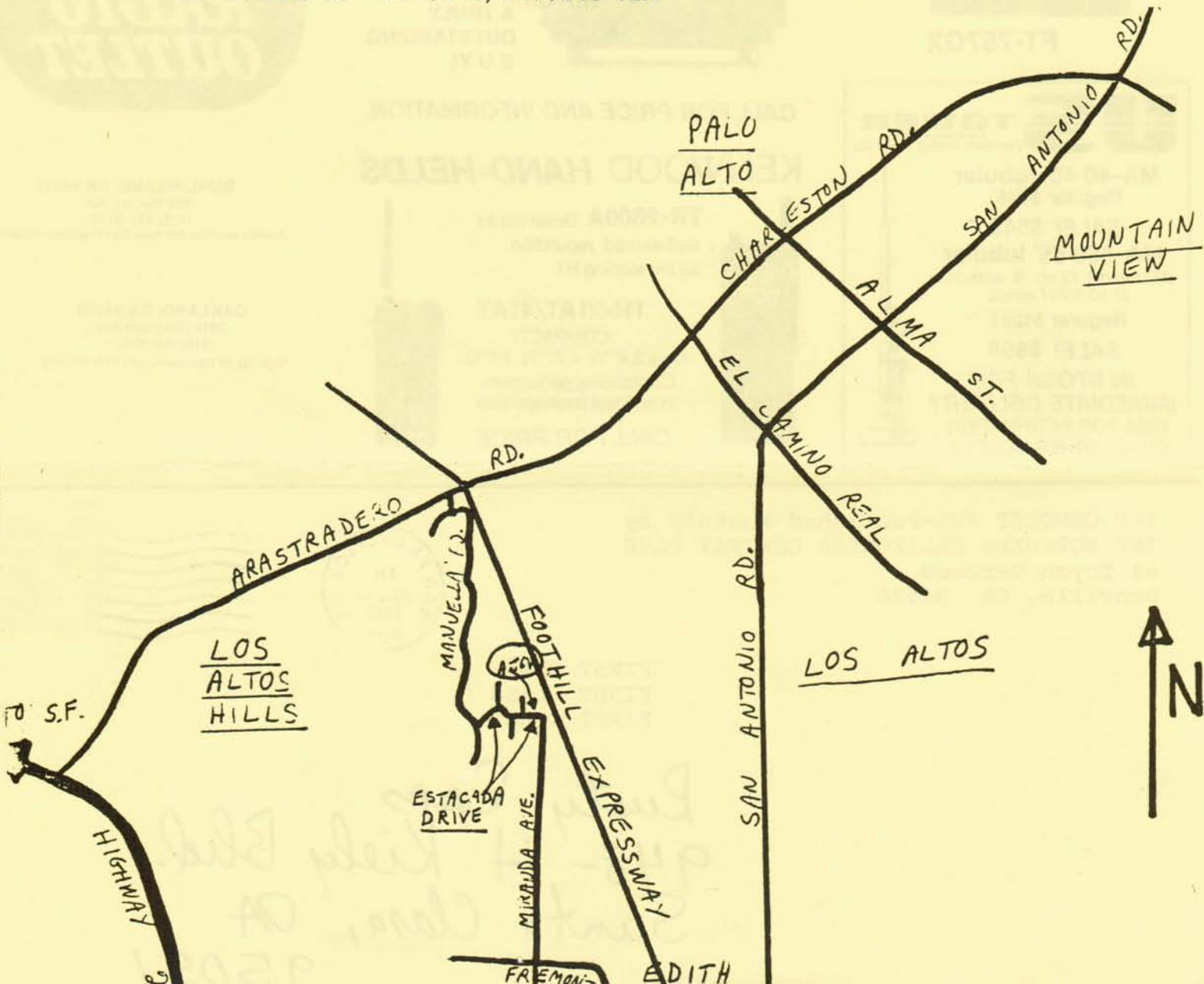

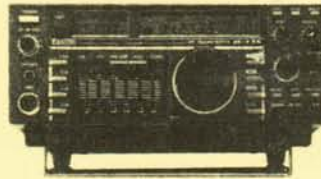
