## CQP 1986

THE FALL CONTEST SEASON BEGINS!!!

Dust off your radio and amplifier, and check out your antennas, because the biggest and the best of all the state QSO Parties is just around the corner!

This year's California QSO Party (September 27 and 28) promises to be a very special event for our Club. No less than 89 NCCC'ers have indicated that they will be active for the test, with 23 of our operators planning CQP county DXpeditions. Our expanded awards program has generated enthusiasm and interest throughout the state and the country. And our massive CQP publicity campaign, in which we have sent out 1,500 promotional brochures to contesters and DX'ers nationwide, should result in some big, big pile-ups, especially at the start of the contest!

Operations from all California counties should not be a problem. As of this writing (September 9) I have confirmed fixed station activity from 45 of our 58 counties, and mobile operation from 4 more. Counties not spoken for at this time include Glenn, Sutter, Placer, Stanislaus, Tuolumne, Mariposa, San Luis Obispo, Orange and Imperial. However, I am still waiting on word on fixed operation from some of these counties, and our core of mobile specialists (K6XO, W6BSY, and KI6CG) should be able to fill in the rest of the gaps on the map.

Our friendly competitors from the South have jumped on the CQP band wagon as well. The Southern California Contest Club has decided to make the '86 Cal QSO Party a major Club operating event. They've divided their Club up into 12 5-man teams, and expect that at least 50% of their members will be active in the test.

A few reminders about the contest -- first and foremost, be sure to try the CW subbands on the half hour. If W6's arrive en masse at the published half hour times, it will generate more out-of-state interest, which will in turn result in W6's staying on code for longer time periods. Don't forget that CW QSO's count three points, while SSB Q's are worth two. Second, the sked time for 160 meters is 0500Z, and the time for 80/75 is 0700 (although activity may be heard on 75 and 80 as early as 0400). Finally, don't overlook 6 and 2 meters as valid QSO's may be made there.

We'd like to get preliminary scores for the CQP right after it ends, so please check in with your numbers either on 3825 KHz or 147.84/.24.

All in all, I'm nothing short of ecstatic about how well this contest is coming together. Many of us in the Club have invested lots of hours in putting together this year's test, and I think the reward will be a 100 KC-wide wall of W6's.

Pray for good condx, see you at the meeting, and hope to work you in the contest!!!

### CQP '86: A PREVIEW OF NCCC ACTIVITY

#### Marin Co. and North Report de Doug, WW6D (ex-WA0JRB)

WW6F (ex-N6BLN) -- Lyle and Len, K6ANP are planning a multi-op effort (all out preparation for their VP5X DXpedition this November) by making a county expedition to Yuba County).

N6QC -- John reports that he and some other Petalumans are trying to put together a Multi-Single operation using the call WB6EGE. (Sonoma Cty)

W6FSJ -- Wendell plans a limited to full operation from Napa.

K6LRN -- Dick states that the 2 element 40 meter beam is now up! Look out for a full KB effort from Marin County!

NG6T -- Bob plans a limited operation. He recently moved and is trying to get the station back together. (Butte Cty)

NA6T -- Bob is ready for an all-out effort from Mendocino County.

WW6D -- Planning a full bore effort, especially on CW.

#### SF and Upper SCV Report de Jim, WA6AUE

San Francisco Co. -- Brook, K4TKM, will be active; Bud, W6WB, will try to be on for a few hours; and Bill, N6OP, will be on, CW only, if in town. Also look for Jim, WA6AUE.

San Mateo Co. -- George, WB6DSV, is rumored to be coming out of semi-retirement with a new complement of antennas for an all-out, KB effort. Also active in San Mateo will be Paul, W6SYL; Stan, K6MO; and Kip, W6SZN (if he is unable to operate portable from Placer Co.).

Dean, N6BV, intends to journey to N6RO in Contra Costa Co. for a token 24-hour single-op effort in the contest.

#### Middle SCV Report de Steve, WC6I

N6BT -- Tom is planning an expedition to Kings County, and has invited WA6VEF along to help with the operating chores.

K6XN, N6IFD, N6MTJ, and N6JXV -- Ted, Carol, Ashley and Steve will be in Monterey Co. for a single-day contest expedition.

W6ISQ -- Jack will be on single-op from Santa Clara Co.

W6VG -- Ron also intends to be on from Santa Clara.

AJ6V -- Ed will also operate from Santa Clara.

W6OKK -- Pat will be on either from rare Santa Clara Co. or Butte Co.

W6OAT -- Rusty is set to guest-op at W6QHS in the Santa Cruz Mountains.

K6MA -- Stan intends to be active again in this year's CQP as part of the K6YA multi-op group on Mt. Tamalpias in Marin Co.

K6TMB -- Lou is considering a contest expedition, but hasn't decided yet which county it will be.

K6PU -- Ken will be on from Amador County.

K6XO -- Alan is planning to help NV6Z with antenna set-up prior to the contest, and then will activate several of our rarer CA counties as a mobile single-op.

KI6CG -- George also plans mobile activities for this year's test.

N6ZB -- Another of this year's county expeditions, Bob will be operating multi-multi from Merced Co. with Jim, KS6H.

N6TJ -- Jim has confirmed that he will activate super-station W6MKB in San Diego County.

#### Upper East Bay Report de Mike, K6MBV

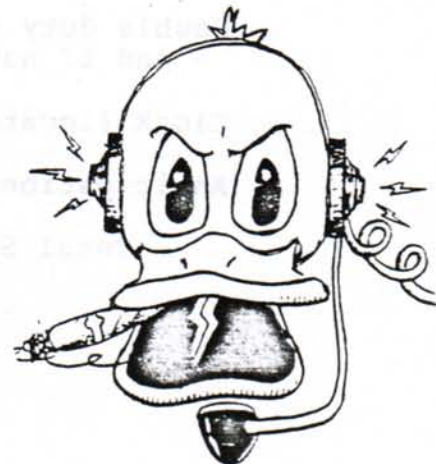

If you have a "commanding signal," then usually best approach to the contest is to CQ at the beginning and search and pounce towards the end when the rate is falling.

If you do not have a commanding signal, then use the reverse approach and search and pounce at the beginning and CQ towards the end. Try CQ-ing in the higher portion of the band to get out of the main congestion, or slide alongside a stronger signal, or sit on the fringe of the main "pack."

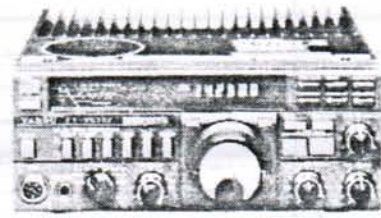
