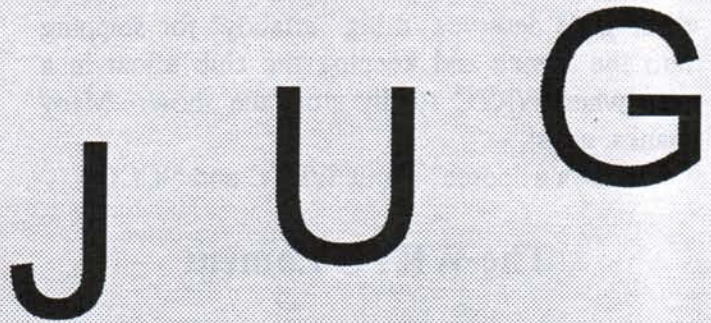

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

The new BOD met at the conclusion of the CQP awards "mailing party" at WA6SDM's house on Saturday, April 26. The awards mailing effort was many hours of work in hot weather, so the BOD meeting was brief. Present were officers AE6Y and N6TV, directors WA6SDM, N6NT, along with K6XX and AD6E. Action minutes are:

1. Meetings are going to be held on the second Monday of the month, instead of the third Friday, starting with Monday, May 12. This is in an effort to pick a day that may be more available to members, and with fewer contest conflicts.
2. CQP mailing info is going out shortly. CQP will now offer low power plaques to the top three low power in and out of state entrants (as we now do for high power.) Although no prizes will be offered, we will also have a QRP box to be checked on the summary sheet.
3. There was extensive discussion of whether and how the rules for mobile ops in CQP should be revised, but no final conclusion was reached. One thought was to make them like the PA QSO party. There, a mobile keeps a separate log for each county, but there is also an overall mobile score listing for which a mobile can aggregate all his QSO's and multipliers to get a total score.
4. Next BOD meeting is Saturday, May 10, from 9 AM to noon at AE6Y's house. Breakfast will be supplied. These meetings are open to any member; if you want to attend, please let me know, since I'm supplying food!

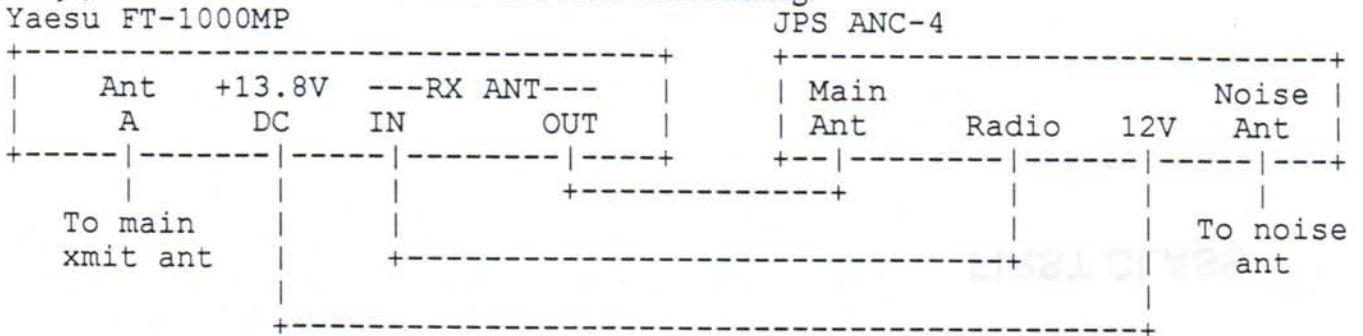

CANCELLING NOISE

I have discovered a great way to use the JPS ANC-4 Noise Canceller with the FT-1000MP. You won't see this little gem explained in either manual, and it may work with Icom radios as well.

With this arrangement, all you have to do is press the "RX Ant" button on the FT-1000MP to activate noise reduction through the ANC-4. You can use the ANC-4 at full QSK speeds, with no switching delays, because the FT-1000MP takes care of all T/R switching.



No RF is ever sent through the ANC-4, except what is picked up by the Noise Ant line during transmit. The relays stay quiet.

If you want to listen to the main antenna, with no noise reduction, just press the RX Ant button again, and you're back to listening on the transmit antenna. The circuit above effectively makes the "RX Ant" button on the FT-1000MP into an "ANC-4 In/Out" switch. It's great for high line noise situations (such as mine).

Here's an important tip: your noise antenna has to hear the same noise as your main antenna, within 10-20 dB, or the ANC-4 can't do its job. I use a low dipole on 20m, and it works great.
