The July meeting enjoyed a large (60) turnout at the home of K6CQF. Besides Ken's fine hospitality and pool, the gang enjoyed the after-meeting pizza gathering and the enlightening talk on antennas by Mike and Mel of KLM Electronics. Many of our members are already using or are in the process of erecting mucho KLM aluminum.

The final, final Field Day tally, submitted by the Aug 2 deadline, totalled 3778 Q's (1296 cw & 2482 fone) and a score of nearly 10,500. One of our claimed bonus points was for the use of emergency power and only planned redundancy prevented disaster here. In the first hour of operation, the big 10KW and another 5KW unit failed. Fortunately, K6AYA works for Honda and the 5KW & 2.5KW units Pat brought along got us back on in minutes and provided full power for the rest of the 4 hours. Many thanks to Pat and to Honda. ANTENNA ERECTIONS: AN SS TURN-ON

Last month this column espoused operator and station improvements as the key to a QUALITY "SS" performance. Unfortunately, words and laudable sentiments do not win contests: actions do. This month let's take a look at where the action is--so far-- in KB country.

W6MSF is currently in the process of creating his own new antenna farm. His big 80' tower culminates in a KLM 20 and a 2ele 40. while a second tower will support 6ele on 15 and 5 on 10. Carl is also planning a fancy VHF array--should be gangbusters!!

W6NLZ, with help from KB6LPK. has a 20 monobander on top of the 125 footer which supports his super quad on 80mtrs. Rumor has it that Pete is working out phasing lines to convert the quad into a 40mtr bi-square when desired. The SCV contingent is really starting to put it all together this year (after East Bay ran away with the "increased activity" laurels last fall). K6EBB is living up at his station QTH and working hard on a super new 20mtr beam between swimming pool installations.

Your scribe is definitely looking forward to playing that KLM JA-ward in the upcoming AA cw contest, and Bill gets a twinkly gleam in his eye every time he talks about his station and the upcoming SS. Could be trouble, folks!

New member WAlKID/6 has glommed onto some very choice antenna acreage in the vicinity of the Peninsula's Skyline Blvd. We're not exactly sure what Bob has up at this point, but judging by FD and Bicentennial hyper-activity, that station is going to be very tough to beat. What's really scary is that the "big" arrays are purportedly still on the drawing board!

Speaking of WA7NIN. Pat has been buying sky needles and other towers, new acreage, etc to ward off the competition. We've also he l rumors concerning a 300' aluminum roof for a low-band(s) ground plane! Pat apparently realizes that it takes more than a slick lawyer to win a contest, and is acting accordingly.

Finally. K6CQF is considering the addition of a tall-tower big-beam combo to his super quiet ridge-top SJV QTH. Anybody know where Ken can lay his hands on some Rohn 45/60 or equivalent for a reasonable price? A 120-footer with a brace of KLM mono-banders on top of it would make that station very difficult to catch.

Not all NCCC erection activity involves big beams and towers, but details of improvement operations on a smaller scale are often difficult to come by because the installer fails to pass the word along to JUG columnists. The "tribander and dipole" set, typically scoring 50K-100K per mode in SS was the BACKBONE of our championship effort last year (just look at the scores). Since then, I'm sure many have replaced the 40m dipole with a 402BA or sloper system; others, a collection of dipol or an all-band vertical. Please make know. what is happening, OM's! Your own improvements will spur on someone else to improve -and that's how "NCCC #1 in the '76 SS" will become a reality.
