### PRESIDENT KEN SAYS

HAPPY NEW YEAR! ALL IN ALL 1983 WAS A GOOD YEAR FOR NCCC. OUR CLUB SCORE IN THE PHONE AND CW CQ WW DX CONTESTS WAS ABOUT 116 MILLION AND SINCE THAT ABOUT EQUALS LAST YEARS WINNING SCORE WE HAVE TO BE A TOP CONTENDER FOR THE 1983 CHAMPIONSHIP. IN ADDITION A NUMBER OF CLUB MEMBERS TURNED IN OUTSTANDING SCORES IN NUMEROUS CONTESTS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR. NOTE THAT THIS YEARS CQ WW RULES REQUIRE CLUBS TO SUBMIT A LIST OF CLUB PARTICIPANTS AND THEIR SCORES. IT IS THUS IMPORTANT THAT EVERYONE SEND ME A COPY OF THEIR SUMMARY SHEET AS SOON AS POSSIBLE SO THAT WE SUBMIT A COMPLETE AND ACCURATE CLUB SCORE.

ELSEWHERE IN THIS JUG YOUWILL FIND RULES FOR THE SPRINT CONTESTS AND PLANS FOR NCCC PARTICIPATION IN THIS EVENT. AT OUR JANUARY 23 MEETING W60AT, N6TV AND K6KLY WILL PRESENT A PROGRAM ABOUT THE SPRINT INCLUDING OPERATING PROCEDURES AMD ORGANIZATION OF NCCC TEAMS. IT SOUNDS LIKE FUN AND IS ONLY FOUR HOURS DURATION. PLAN TO PARTICIPATE AND AT LEAST GET ON TO GIVE CONTACTS TO YOUR FELLOW NCCC MEMBERS.

IN THE CQ WW CONTESTS WE RECEIVED GREAT SUPPORT FROM THE NCDXC AND ALL DUAL MEMBERS. TO RETURN THE FAVOR ALL DUAL MEMBERS ARE ASKED TO SUBMIT THEIR SCORES IN THE ARRL DX CONTESTS FOR NCDXC. THE CW CONTEST IS FEB. 18-19 AND THE PHONE CONTEST IS MARCH 3-4. THE NCCC WILL NOT SUBMIT AN ENTRY IN THE ARRL CONTESTS.

# NCCC FIELDS FIRST SPRINT TEAM -CW-

IN ORDER TO ENCOURAGE COMPETITION AND INCREASE PARTICIPATION IN THE NORTH AMERICAN SPRINT CONTESTS, THE BOD IS ORGANIZING MEMBERS OF THE NCCC INTO SEVERAL TEN MAN TEAMS.

THE FIRST TEAM, KNOWN AS "NCCC TEAM #1" IS A "SEATED" TEAM. MEMBERSHIP ON THIS TEAM IS BASED ON THE HIGHEST SCORES EVER SUBMITTED IN PAST SPRINTS:

For the February CW Sprint we're giving Team #1 credit for old past glory, but this is one time only. From now on, the rankings will be determined by the results of the most recent Sprint. The top thirty NCCC members in the February Sprint will automatically be placed on one of the seated teams in the following Sprint. Who knows, maybe some of the people on Team #1 will find themselves on Team #2 and vice versa. This just might get interesting.

### 1984 NORTH AMERICAN SPRINT CONTESTS

### Sponsored by the National Contest Journal

- 1. Eligibility: Any licensed radio amateur may enter.
- 2. Object: To work as many North American stations (and/or other stations if you are in North America) as possible and as many multipliers as possible during the contest period.
- 3. Entry Classification: Single operator only. Use of helpers or spotting nets is not permitted.
- 4. Contest Periods: 01:00 through 04:59 UTC. CW Sprints are February 5 and September 16; Phone Sprints are February 12 and September 23 (Saturday nights, February 4 and 11 and September 15 and 22, local time). These are four entirely separate four-hour Sprints. An entrant may submit scores for one or more Sprints, but he may not combine his scores.
- 5. Mode: CW only in CW Sprints; Phone only in Phone Sprints.
- 6. Bands: 80, 40 and 20 meters only. Suggested frequencies are around 3540, 7040 and 14040 kHz on CW, and 3900, 7225 and 14280 on Phone. You may work the same station once per band.
- 7. Exchange: To have a valid exchange, you must send all of the following information: The other station's call, your call, your serial number, your name and your location (state, province or country).

Example: WA7NIN de K5ZD nr 118 Randy TX K
K5ZD 105 Pat NV de WA7NIN K

- 8. Valid Contact: A valid contact consists of a complete, correctly copied and logged two way exchange between a North American station and another station. Proper logging requires including the time of each contact. Serial numbers must begin with serial number one (001) and must be sequential thereafter. Regardless of the number of licensed callsigns issued to a given operator, one and only one callsign shall be utilized during the contest by that operator.
- 9. North American Station: Defined by the rules of the CQ WW DX Contests.
- 10. Scoring: Multiply total valid contacts by the sum of states, VE provinces and other North American countries to get final score (do not count USA and VE as countries). KH6 is not counted as a state and is not a North American country. The eight Canadian multipliers are Maritime (VE1, VO1 and VO2), VE2 through 7, and Yukon-NWT (VY1 and VE8). Non-North American countries do not count as multipliers.

- 11. Special OSY Rule: If any station solicits a call (by sending CQ, QRZ?, QRZ, etc.), he is permitted to work only one station in response to that solicitation. He must thereafter move at least 1 kHz before he works any other station, or at least 5 kHz before he again solicits other calls.
- 12. Reporting: CW Sprint entries must be sent to Rusty Epps, W6OAT, 948-H Kiely Boulevard, Santa Clara, CA 95051 and Phone Sprint entries to Rick Niswander, K7GM, 1914 West Cortez Circle, Chandler, AZ 85224. Entries must be received not later than 30 days after the Sprint to be eligible for trophies and awards. An entry consists of (1) a summary sheet showing the number of valid contacts by band, total contacts, total multipliers, total score, name, callsign and address of the operator, station callsign and station location; (2) a complete, legible log of all contacts (including dupes marked as such) with indication by numbered sequence of each multiplier claimed; and (3) a separate check sheet for each band. Logs, summary sheets, and check sheets home-made or be patterned after those published periodically in the NCJ.
- 13. Team Competition: Team competition is limited to a maximum of 10 operators as a single entry unit. Groups having more than ten members may submit more than one team entry. contest requirement: To qualify as a team entry, the name, callsign of each operator, and callsign of the station operated should the operator be a quest at a station other than his own (eg., WA7NIN op by W6OAT) must be registered with W6OAT for the CW Sprints and with K7GM for the Phone Sprints. The team information may be contained either in a letter, which must be received before the start of the Sprint, or it may be contained in a Western Union mailgram dated at least 24 hours before the start of the Sprint. There are neither distance limitations nor meeting requirements for a team entry. The only requirement is preregistration of the team.
- 14. Penalties and Disqualifications: For each unmarked duplicate QSO, you lose that contact plus an additional three contacts; for each QSO for which you are not in the other station's log, you lose that QSO plus an additional one contact; and for each QSO for which the log data is incorrectly copied in any respect, you lose that contact. Entries with score reductions in excess of 5% will be disqualified. Any entry also may be disqualified for illegibility, illegal or non-ethical operation. Such disqualification is at the discretion of the NCJ Contest Review Committee.
- 15. Awards: A trophy will be awarded to the highest scoring entrant. Certificates of merit will be awarded to the highest scoring entrant from each USA call district, Canada, and other country; to each of the ten highest scoring entrants; to each member of the winning team; and to the highest scoring entrant on each team.

### Minutes -- NCCC Membership Meeting -- November 21, 1983

The meeting was attended by numerous members and guests, including W3LPL. Guests WA6ADR, W6REC, WB6CUA, and N6IYI were elected to membership during the meeting.

Reported and projected CQWW scores were announced, together with a propagation forecast prepared for the CW weekend by W6RQ. Slides depicting CQWW activities at several home and dxpedition locations were shown. The meeting was adjourned early for pizza, beer, and last-minute preparations for the impending Big Weekend (CQWW CW).

#### Minutes -- NCCC Membership Meeting -- December 17, 1983

This event was the occasion of the NCCC 1983 Christmas Banquet, arranged by N6AUV at the Velvet Turtle in Burlingame. A super turnout of 77 members and guests enjoyed the festivities, MC'ed by N6BT, including prizes, awards, and an excellent program, as well as the election to membership of W6JKV and K6YT and the presentation of a dozen long-stemmed roses to Louese, KA6ING, in recognition and thanks for her active and generous support of club activities.

The following awards were presented as a result of the deliberations of the awards committee (WA6VEF, W6SZN, K6RU, N6RO, and AI6V):

World-Class Contester (a new award): to Rich Smith, N6KT, recognizing his numerous first-place entries and new records in recent contests, including the 1983 ARRL DX SSB first-place finish at AI6V, the tremendous effort in the 1983 CQWW SSB at PJ2FR, recent top scores at 4T4O, KH6XX, and N6KT/HKO, and world records in the WPX and CQP.

KB Award (revived from the SS days): to Ron Chiappari, N6AUV, in recognition of his sustained support of the NCCC, as well as his development and achievements as a contester, as exemplified by his efforts at XE2BC and AI6V/KH6 in the 1983 CQWW, efforts at N6RO and KH6XX, and several recent project and event chairmanships.

Contester of the Year: to Ken Ruddock, K6HNZ, for his 1983 CQWW achievements in organizing, promoting, and executing the tremendous multi-multi efforts at TI1C for SSB and at his own station for CW, as well as the top 1983 CQP county expedition score, his perennial North American top score in the AA SSB, and his untiring efforts as 1983/84 NCCC President and 1983 CQWW chairman.

The meeting program featured a beautiful and entertaining presentation by Jay, W6GO, of the people and sights of French Polynesia, as he and Jan, K6HHD, encountered them on their 1982 and 1983 FOOJO and FOOOJ CQWW expeditions.




