NCCC TO K SOME B IN FEBRUARY NORTH AMERICAN SPRINTS

Continuing the intra-club comeptition in the NA Sprints, and expanding our participation level, is the goal of your friendly sprint coordinators, W6RGG/CW and WA6VEF/SSB.

We have been able to "rescue" some of our members from participation in "foreign" teams, and have come up with five complete CW teams and four complete SSB teams.

The CW Sprint will be saturday night, February 1, local time (starting at 0000 UTC, February 2) and the phone sprint will be February 8, local time (starting at 0000 UTC, February 9). That's 4:00 p.m. PST, in case you forgot! The complete rules are shown elsewhere in this issue.

Participants in the September 1984 Sprint are "seeded" according to their scores as published in the NCJ. Only the September scores were considered, pursuant to the rules published in an earlier Jug.

This is where the competition really starts, because your score in this Sprint determines which team you will be on for the September Sprint. The top ten scores for each mode will make up September's NCCC #1, the next ten NCCC #2, etc. The only way you can move to a higher team, or to a higher position within a team, is to knock off someone ahead of you!

If you are on a team and find you will be unable to participate in February, and if you notify Bob or Gary at least 72 hours before the start of the Sprint that you won't be on, we'll advance everyone below you one position in order to fill your place. However, we'll also "hold your place" for one Sprint by permitting you to use your September '85 score (or your current team assignment, if made without the benefit of a previous score) again to determine your position on the team for September '86. If you don't get on, and we don't hear from you, or if you get on but don't send in your log, you go back to the bottom of the pile and have to work your way back up.

This year's Sprints provide us with an opportunity to live up to our "#1 Contest Club" position. If you can't operate the full Sprint, get on and give contacts to as many of our members as you can. Listen to techniques in use and plan on using them yourself in September.

1986 NORTH AMERICAN SPRINT CONTESTS

Sponsored by the National Contest Journal

- 1. Eligibility: Any licensed radio amateur may enter.
- Object: To work as many North American stations (and/or other stations if you are in North America) as possible and as many multipliers as possible during the contest period.
- 3. Entry Classification: Single operator only. Use of helpers or spotting nets is not permitted.
- 4. Contest Periods: 00:00 through 03:59 UTC. CW Sprints are February 2 and September 14; Phone Sprints are February 9 and September 21 (Saturday nights, February 1 and 8 and September 13 and 20, local time). These are four entirely separate four-hour Sprints. An entrant may submit scores for one or more Sprints, but he may not combine his scores.
- 5. Mode: CW only in CW Sprints; Phone only in Phone Sprints.
- 6. Bands: 80, 40 and 20 meters only. Suggested frequencies are around 3540, 7040 and 14040 kHz on CW, and 3900, 7225 and 14280 on Phone. You may work the same station once per band.
- 7. Exchange: To have a valid exchange, you must send all of the following information: The other station's call, your call, your serial number, your name and your location (state, province or country).

Example: WA7NIN de K5ZD nr 118 Randy TX K K5ZD 105 Pat NV de WA7NIN K

- 8. Valid Contact: A valid contact consists of a complete, correctly copied and logged two way exchange between a North American station and another station. Proper logging requires including the time of each contact. Serial numbers must begin with serial number one (001) and must be sequential thereafter. Regardless of the number of licensed callsigns issued to a given operator, one and only one callsign shall be utilized during the contest by that operator.
- 9. North American Station: Defined by the rules of the CQ WW DX Contests.
- 10. Scoring: Multiply total valid contacts by the sum of states, VE provinces and other North American countries to get final score (do not count USA and VE as countries). KH6 is not counted as a state and is not a North American country. The eight Canadian multipliers are Maritime (VE1, VO1 and VO2), VE2 through 7, and Yukon-NWT (VY1 and VE8). Non-North American countries do not count as multipliers.

- 11. Special QSY Rule: If any station solicits a call (by sending CQ, QRZ?, QRZ, etc.), he is permitted to work only one station in response to that solicitation. He must thereafter move at least 1 kHz before he works any other station, or at least 5 kHz before he again solicits other calls.
- 12. Reporting: CW Sprint entries must be sent to Rusty Epps, W60AT, 948-H Kiely Boulevard, Santa Clara, CA 95051 and Phone Sprint entries to Rick Niswander, K7GM, 1914 West Cortez Circle, Chandler, AZ 85224. Entries must be received not later than 30 days after the Sprint to be eligible for trophies and awards. An entry consists of (1) a summary sheet showing the number of valid contacts by band, total contacts, total multipliers, total score, name, callsign and address of the operator, station callsign and station location; (2) a complete, legible log of all contacts (including dupes marked as such) with indication by numbered sequence of each multiplier claimed; and (3) a separate check sheet for each band. Logs, summary sheets, and check sheets may be home-made or patterned after those published periodically in the NCJ.
- 13. Team Competition: Team competition is limited to a maximum of 10 operators as a single entry unit. Groups having more than ten members may submit more than one team entry. Precontest requirement: To qualify as a team entry, the name, callsign of each operator, and callsign of the station operated should the operator be a guest at a station other than his own (eg., WA7NIN op by W60AT) must be registered with W60AT for the CW Sprints and with K7GM for the Phone Sprints. The team registration information must be in written or telegraphic form and must be received before the start of the Sprint. There are neither distance limitations nor meeting requirements for a team entry. The only requirement is pre-registration of the team.
- 14. Penalties and Disqualifications: For each unmarked duplicate QSO, you lose that contact plus an additional three contacts; for each QSO for which you are not in the other station's log, you lose that QSO plus an additional one contact; and for each QSO for which the log data is incorrectly copied in any respect, you lose that contact. Entries with score reductions in excess of 5% will be disqualified. Any entry also may be disqualified for illegibility, illegal or non-ethical operation. Such disqualification is at the discretion of the NCJ Contest Review Committee.
- 15. Awards: A trophy will be awarded to the highest scoring entrant. Certificates of merit will be awarded to the highest scoring entrant from each USA call district, Canada, and other country; to each of the ten highest scoring entrants; to each member of the winning team; and to the highest scoring entrant on each team.
