Let's resurrect the weekly 2M net.

How about some more interest in field day? Field day might be a good way to get to know each other better.

How about a club sponsored plaque for single OP stations with tribander and KW in contest in which we make greatest effort.

Seems to be lack of enthusiasm for contests other that CQP, SS or CQWW. The club might try promoting others, such as ALL ASIA. Years ago intraclub competetion (teams) was popular. DX packet cluster may bring new members and enthusiasm. Expand content of the Jug to further rekindle support for the club.

Find lower cost restaurant like Harry's Hofbrau.

Meet monthly during contest season, every other month in summer.

We need lectures on improving contest station and operating techniques.

The club has become soft on the basics.

Except CQP, we have no real major club efforts.

Meetings uninteresting, very little thought goes into programs.

We never talk about how to do better at radio contesting.

There's been no new roster for a year and a half.

The Jug does not contain features on contesting (a'la the NCJ)

I like programs on contest and Dxpedition planning.

Some of us have to limit our contesting. Would like suggestions on how to get the most from the time I do have.

Let's concentrate on skill enhancement at meetings.

I am willing to participate in meeting planning.

Form 5 person teams of part time operators. Each

Operates 5-10 hours. Give award to winning operator or team.

Would like to see more cooperation, like in the early days.

Every member should be encouraged to participate in as many contests as possible.

I suggest a minimum goal of 300-400k per year.

Any good contest club member should be able to score that in a year with a dipole and in his sleep.

Jug is not specific about which contests it expects members to be active in and submit scores.

Hope the club doesn't "faction-out."

Sections or Intra-Club teams may help with Rusty's concerns.

Would like to have more meetings closer to San Jose. I have given up contesting because I was spending too much time in front of a radio, instead of enjoying the beautiful outdoors and our spectacular climate. But I continue to support the NCCC.

Less emphasis on scores and more on helping all achieve larger scores. Too much of the club budget goes toward award programs. Reactivate "the erector set" with several groups competing for most feet of tower and most elements put up each year. Dinner meeting should be at places that don't charge \$15-20 for a poor meal. I'd rather not have dinner than pay good money for garbage. Good luck!

Meetings must start on time.

Regardless of anything, the President should keep meetings moving along. Encourage newcomers, reduce the "clique" appearance.

It's a hobby...no assasinations...very tacky.

Attack the problem with QRM on our repeater from Heavenly Valley. Proceed agressively with official complaints about the Heavenly QRM problem.

Point all beams at Heavenly and talk on 724 so they get the message.

Maybe we could rotate meeting places.

We need more interesting programs at meetings. Antennas, operating, video tapes of operations, score projections, etc. These are topics for better meetings.

The club needs a well defined direction. How about a five year plan to win ARRL DX in the unlimited class category. This would give us continuity from year to year, members would set up their stations toward that goal, there would be a reason for new members to join, etc. One of the things that held the NCCC together so well in the 1975-1980 years was the concentration on Sweepstakes every year. There was continuity, intra-club rivalry, the desire to beat last year's score (both individual and club). In general, there was lots of interest. Let's pick one contest for a multi-year effort rather than each year asking, "What do we want to do this year?"

Let's either find what interests and motivates the largest number of members, or else find something to involve a smaller but more active group.

Your dinner meetings are a little too expensive.

We need better matching of OPS to open stations. Better marketing of DXpeditions for CQWW to help club score.

Sometimes I feel like an outsider because of lack of skills, scores, sophisticated station, etc.

My scores are not great, but they are improving. I enjoy contesting very much.
