

(K8HVT). "Great county coverage." (W5NR). You guys talked me into trying the CQP a little more seriously." (N5OLS). "Highlight: K6AAW on 21 MHz SSB at 59+." (G3IZJ). Man, is it tough to penetrate the QRM; from out here." (ZS6BCR). My enjoyment was the sweep—all 58." (WA4PGM). Enroute Australia, "I'll set a record as possibly the only VK4 in CQP." (VE3BQL).

And some offer suggestions: "Best contest and most fun. BUT, too many two letter California stations...with...too much power. Clamp a lid on power." (W9CGJ). "Really did meet some fine operators." (VE1REC). Hate not to get in the CQP. Very addictive." (AA4NC). "Fantastic contest." (N8LXS). "Dear purveyors of CQP fun...best state party to hit the ham bands." (KC8FS). "I won't let business get in the way next year." (N5OVV). "Even got a new country, 9L1US." (W6IFC). "Highlight: worked ZA1QA on 15 CW." (AD6E).

"The first year I used computer logging and made two pilot errors." (NS6V).


