ARRL DX Contest Notes

I am collecting scores for both NCCC and NCDXC for the ARRL DX contests. If you are a member of both groups, submit your log to the ARRL naming the DX club; otherwise, submit for NCCC. Please clearly specify your club affiliation to me, as I will make two submissions to the ARRL. Only a few scores are here by my JUG deadline, so results will appear next month.

Conditions for the CW weekend were well down from last year. The contest coincided with the monthly solar flux low. However, that means the 'phone weekend will fall near the monthly flux peak.

An interesting event occurred during the contest. A packet spot for a 9V on 80m came through. Nothing was on the exact spot frequency or a kHz above (as usual), but 150Hz below was a weak signal working someone. As I listened for a callsign, the frequency burst into a big pile-up. The weak signal operator changed to his fast pace, not signing his call. Lots of us fought it out, many making it into the "9V"'s log. Cajoled by a chorus of "?" and "CL?", the "9V" finally signed--JA3 something. The startled, extremely popular JA was further surprised when his instant pile-up instantly disappeared.

Wonder how many locals have a "9V" in their log from this erroneous spot...?

**1992 CALIFORNIA QSO PARTY (CQP)
RESULTS**

The 1992 California QSO Party is history and the Postmaster in our four person post office is now speaking to me again. There were 208 non-California and 157 California logs received. Eleven USA stations (NX3A, N4WNL, VE4GV, VE7NKG, K8AQM, AA8AV, KA9FOX, KE9I, KC0GM, W3HDH/Ø, KB6LO/Ø) managed to find all 58 California Counties. Twenty-six California stations managed a clean sweep. Wyoming was the most commonly missed section. Participants ranged in age from KB3ADQ (14) to N3CZB (84).

SOAPBOX - California

Could I possibly work VY1JA six times, VE8CM once, and then miss Alaska?.. W6UQF; We operated from a rental RV and had problems mounting the antennas.. K8HVT; This is my third year contesting the CQP, Zip activity on 160 heard.. KB6LZW; Stayed on the air with 3 storage batteries, peak power was 500 at start and dwindled to 10.. W6TVP; Keeping clear of W1FEA (4 miles) is a real feat.. K6DGW; Missed Wyo for 2nd straight year but plenty of VE8/VY1 QSOs.. AB6FO; Thunderstorm blew down the antenna before the QSO party but my OM got it up in time.. K16OS; TU4EB called me, first Ivory Coast ever! .. KJ6DL; My "7" call is somewhat of a disadvantage in the QSO party (on CW).. KF7AM/6; Operating site in Mono county was at 11,160 feet, daytime temp was 36-38 F.. WA6FIT; Usually operate from Calaveras or Alpine Counties, but for this year had very little time.. W6PLJ.

SOAPBOX - Out of state

My first ever contest and I really enjoyed it.. WD8LCH; Not as much fun with only a dipole at 12 feet - tnx to Andrew.. K4MF; There was more courtesy and good sportsmanship this year.. WAØOTV; I was planning a big effort from HV3 but my sweet Italian YL convinced me we should "go south" to the Med islands north of Sicily.. W7SW; Again I have to wait for the Best Weekend.. JJ7XTV; Only worked 13 hours as I couldn't find anybody new to work.. KØPP/7; Tripled my score from last year and I enjoyed it very much.. K4PIC; On CW the strongest sig on 40 was W1FEA/6, K6NA was strongest on 80.. VE3HX; Now I know how CA stations must feel during the salmon run - hearing all those East Coast guys.. KX7L; Saturday I heard NO stateside at all let alone West Coast.. G3IZJ; Only a short opening during Sunday afternoon, anyhow worked 2 new Cal counties.. DJ8WD; I know the CA counties better than the ones in Tennessee.. K4LTA; QRM was heavy and QRN from XYL downstairs also.. KB2MVF; I beat my last yrs score by 5.000, spent more time on CW this year.. KC8FS; I did manage to make a few contacts to keep my CQP streak alive at 16 consecutive.. WB5DTK: All my assistant Ops were Novice/Techs.. K8AQHM; Great test, can't forget the thrill of sweeping.. KCØGM; Was nice to exchange reports with many friends in the CQP once again.. K7SV; Still the most fun that a person can legally have in 24 hours.. NH6T; The rate was so good that Hubby (WA6VEF/VE7NTT) was totally shocked that by Saturday night I was ahead of his same time QSO number of two years ago, and then came dismal Sunday.. VE7NKL; I decided to make a

sincere effort this year and spent three weekends erecting an 1100 foot long wire antenna, next year I'll aim the antenna directly at Lake County.. N8KSO; Another well done Cal QSO party.. AE2N; The CQP is the only County/State test I know where a lower power station with a wire antenna can maintain a rate approaching 60 QSOs an hour, had 200 QSOs in 267 minutes.. K2UFT; Best one in the last ten years.. AB4HR; Always a fun test, good to see the KD6 guys, contesting always needs new blood.. AA4NC; This was my first contest, thanks to N6VR, KC6ACI, KD6CGJ, KM6OH, and WA6DJS that took the time to welcome me to amateur radio.. KB5UZV; The contest group should thank W6UQF for inviting me to be in the CQP.. VY1JA.

Notes: Low power is 200 watts or less output. If power wasn't indicated, more than 200 watts was assumed. Many W6 stations apparently do not realize that DX stations may be worked for points but do not count for multipliers. For those people that submit more than log per mail envelope, please add a cover note that indicates this. Thanks to Al, AD6E, for the publicity and to Jim, WA6SDM, for handling the awards.


