

A NEW TUBE FOR AMPLIFIER BREWERS

Recent e-mail "chatter" has included talk of a surplus ceramic/metal high-power triode from Russia, the GS-35B, which features "instant on" *i.e.* it has a directly-heated cathode. One contributor writes "Well, my latest info shows the supplier to be a legitimate ham, who wants to help others obtain these beauties at incredible prices. Do any of you want to include a tube or two for yourself?

I plan to modify my old 2 x 813 amp that came with a huge HV supply, with the GS 35B. Maybe I'll do the same for the 4-400 Amp... though I like the looks of orange plates, and bright filaments, which would be lost with the GS-35B. The 35B only needs about 3 amps at 12v for filament (Cathode), and can easily put out 1.5kw, apparently as high as 1 gHz.

The grid connection is a metal ring/flange, which can be mounted directly to chassis, so no sockets are needed. Use GS-35B as a search term, and you will

find pictures of this tube on the web. Can anyone convert 1500 liters per minute to Cubic feet per minute? Specifications say the tube needs 1500 liters per minute at maximum dissipation.

Courtesy and high operating skills marked this contest.


K9DIY
