With the outages on contesting.com, some of our score totals are not complete, and will be published in the next JUG issue. Our web site will have February scores posted as soon as the system is restored. This month's JUG scores feature the huge CQP listing. Congratulations to all the "winners" and thanks to AD6E for managing this NCCC-sponsored event.

The major club effort for the spring season is the WPX SSB contest on March 24-25. We have won this a few times, and could do it again. (Results of the 2000 contest will not be published until the CW test results are published, probably in the May CQ.) I like this contest because you can work everyone, both DX and domestic, and on all bands. With last years' rules change, every Q counts for points, more for DX, and even more for low band DX. Many members are expeditioning and have their plans made. For those of us staying in home territory, plan for the biggest effort We will accumulate (and post on the website,) your forecast scores, to get an idea of who intends to do what. Through the reflector we can match stations with operators where appropriate. Use of the website and email reflector was a worthwhile system for SS, and should prove so again for WPX. I'll announce this on the NCCC reflector when the website is able to post the listings of projected scores.

A reminder on posting claimed scores after any contest: Please send an email to the reflector, with your numbers, omitting the summary sheet boiler plate info. That way everyone subscribed can see your scores and soapbox comments, and WOYK can post the numbers on the website databases. If you are not on the internet, send summary sheets to the vp/cc or WOYK, so we can publish scores in the JUG listings. KB in WPX!
