# My Townhome Shack - Byron N6NUL

I finally managed to get up on my 12 pitch (45 degree) roof, and what did I find? Wasps. So, I do not have pictures to share on how steep and scary it is up there, nor my new antennas. That will come after I get rid of the little buggers. So, instead, Field Day!

Like a lot of hams, I am of several minds when it comes to Field Day. Mostly neutral, sometimes drifting to intense dislike. It does provide an excellent opportunity to prepare for CQP, however, and that is my plan this year! Even if Field Day isn't your thing, if you need practice for a CQP county expedition, it's a great excuse.

My trusty Cabela's Alaknak 12'x12' outfitters tent that our crew uses needs some attention. Some grommets need to be added, and perhaps some velcro strips around a couple of the window shades.

We have wanted to attach some home-made cordura ducting to one of the side windows to improve the effectiveness of a box fan used for ventilation; the velcro would be used to attach the flexible ducting. We have also had some discussion about making portable air coolers in 5 gallon buckets (either blowing across ice, or an evaporation/swamp style), and if we get to it, one or more might be attempted.

Lastly, I want to try out a few easy-to-lift delta loop antennas using aluminum tubes for the top section. With wire sides and going down to a 600 ohm open wire feeder, it should make a very easy to use setup, even if it is not a beam. We may even try to use it as a top-loaded short vertical with the addition of some radials.



Here's what you may have missed:




