SUPPORT YOUR CLUB

The first big event scheduled for club participation is the All Asian DX Contest from 1000Z August 28, 1971 to 1600Z August 29, 1971. A scheme has been developed whereby you can compete as a member of NCCC and perhaps win one of the eight first place certificates/trophies.

A multiplier will be applied to single band scores to provide a means of evaluating operating proficiency for a club achievement award. The following table based upon a multi band score of 60,000 points will be used:

160M	X5000	15M	8X
80M	X150	lom	X60
40M	X13	All Bands	Xl
20M	X6	Multi Opr	X.85

It is hoped this integration of organizational and contest goals will provide the means to sweep all of the entry classifications. A rules extract for the All Asian DX Contest follows with complete details at the meeting.

- 1. CONTEST PERIOD: 1000Z August 28, 1971 to 1600Z August 29, 1971. (During the fourth week-end of August)
- 2. ENTRY CLASSIFICATIONS:
 - (a) Single Band Single Operator
 - (b) Multi Band Single Operator
 - (c) Multi Band Multi Operator Single Band
- 3. BANDS: 1.8, 3.5, 7.0, 14.0, 21.0, and 28.0 Mhz.; CW only.
- 4. SERIAL NUMBERS: RST report plus a two figure number denoting your age (Example; if your age is 26, the number will be the RST plus 26) YL stations may use ØØ for their age.
- 5. POINTS AND MULTIPLIERS: Contacts with Asian stations only will count one point and a multiplier of one for each Asian PREFIX worked on each band, using the WPX format.
- 6. SCORING: The total score will be the sum of prefix multipliers of each band, multiplied by the sum of the contact points on each band. Contacts between stations except in Asia will not be counted for contact or multiplier credit.
- 7. AWARDS: Certificates will be awarded for each section of the contest--see 2 above.

Operate any 20 hours between 2300Z Sat. and 0500Z Mon., break times 15min. minimum, no power multiplier. Activity up from ..030 on each cw band, up from 3900, 7265, 14275, 21550, 23600 on SSB. Active periods (from past experience): Saturday, 23-0000Z on 21mc; 00-0300Z on 14mc; 03-05Z on 7mc; 05-06Z on 3.5. Sunday: 21mc 15-2100Z on the hour; 28mc 1530-2030Z on the half-hours, same eventing hour activity as Saturday. Activity during "hot" periods can reach 60-80 QSOs per hour. CU CD de WA6DKF Ken.
