A whele lot of people (plus 15 meters) came through for the NCCC on the 'phone weekend: We demolished our old Club Aggregate record of 9.55 Meg-a-points and any club that beats us --if that does, in fact happen-- will deserve to win. To one and all, congratulations on absolutely INCREDIBLE EFFORT.

In your humble (?) SS Coordinator's opinion, we have the potential to be $\mathrm{F}_{1}$ in SS again this year. The only thing that can stop us now is for people to:

1) Fail to send in their logs, or
2) Fail to carefully remove all dupes from
their logs before mailing them in, or 3) Not mailing in logs by the 22 nd deadline.
We need every score to be absolutely sure so send in your duped logs, up-to-date dupesheet, summary sheet and a self-addressed-stamped-postcard (to be sure it arrives) to the ARRL as soon as possible. If you want to be certain of everything, make a photocopy of your logs, etc, and if WA1STN has not returned your card by Christmas Day, then send him a second set of data. Also, please let your AC know your final duped scores preferably by giving him (or CEP) a copy of your summary sheets so that the club letter can be mailed with accurate info.

It's really been great to work with such a turned-on bunch of Area Coordinators and Contest Operators. I am looking forward to handing out a whole stack of awards to you guys at the Christmas Banquet.

## A FEW SS NOTES AND WHO REALLY DID WIN??

With one hour and fifteen minutes to go, WøTR (formerly WADCVS) with WBøDJY at the controls was about 35 QSO's ahead of KV4FZ with K7VPF maddly screaming in to the mike for anyone to give him a Q. George had fifteen minutes of off time remaining, which he took just before the start of the last hour. There they were both TR and FZ on 40 meters, three kHz apart scrambling for every last contact. Chip was pulling closer, but to have a rate 35 better than George in the last hour?? Impossible. Or was it.

As you all know, conditions were acting long and that is exactly what happer ed. Forty went long, forcing TR to go down to 75 meters, leaving Chip alone on 40 with long skip and his BIG signal. Chip started to roll. Each minute that ticked off the timer brought him another Q closer to George.

Last year in SS, Chip set the all-tine record of 1742 QSO's. It should be nded that our own WA7NIN operated by hired gun W60AT broke this record with a total of 1809 QSO's. A tremendous effort at Pat's station, especially considering all the problems that plagued Pat this year (we'll let him fill us in later).

Even the boys down in SCCC-Land failed to crack the old-record-barrier. WB6YBL has an edge on W6HX with unduped scores of $1640 \times 75$ and $1638 \times 75$ respectively. K6AC followed with a close $1550 \times 75$.

George was having his problems on 75 . His rate was dropping and nothing seemed to be going his way. Indeed it wasn't. Chip was cranking off Q's like mad on 40. Could it be that George would lose the battle in the last few minutes of a full 24 hours?? After leading probably every hour in the entire contest?? It surely could be. When the clocks ticked to all 0000, George had 1944 and Chip had. 1956. Twelve QSO's. Chip had run a rate of nearly 50 Q's higher than George in that last 60 minutes due to the 40 meter conditions, or maybe due to the poor 75 con ditions that had faced George.

As we all know, raw scores have an inherent problem. Dupes. Good ole dupes. A few days later, after the ionosphere cooled down and the pencil lead began to flow on the check sheet, the order of finish had changed. Chip had encountered about 25 more dupes than George, leaving the margin between first and second again about the same 12 contacts. George's final score is 1915-1920×75 and Chip's is 1902-1903×75, both men going over their logs again - just to be sure.

Imagine smashing the record by over 150 Q's. That's a rate of over 80 per hour for the entire contest. Some of us have yet to reach that level even for a single hour!!! But, we all keep on trying and striving for our own personal best efforts. Many have made such significant improvements that they are worthy of our column space in your JUG. How 'bout it?
