### 1976 NCCC FIELD DAY

Yes, we're doing it as a unified Club effort. You saw what organization, leadership and commitment of the membership did for our SS effort. These elements will make possible a national win in our category and maybe a scoring record for FD in that class. In the past few years, several factions of the Club have fared well in national standings (2nd in 5A and 2A). The BoD decided this year to promote a full-bore Club effort for FD -- and we'll do it!

Planning is the key to FD and initial ideas are spinning wildly in the Chairman's head. A meeting will be held in late March to determine site location, logistics and a myriad of other considerations. Invited will be all team captains, staff coordinators and others turned on by the idea of a biggie FD by NCCC.

Initial ideas include 5-transmitter category with big antennas on all bands, hilltop QTH, etc. What ultimately happens depends on the people involved, particularly how many people. We can't man 5 xmtrs with 4 people, so we need commitments from all interested early enough in the planning to know which category to enter. This in turn determines antennas and equipment requirements. Initial surveys show we have enough towers, antennas and equipment to man 8-10 xmtrs, but we need to know who will set them up and keep them on for 24 hours.

#### DALE'S ALIVE & WELL IN TEHRAN

Word has been received from NCCC member Dale Jones (W6GEN/W7CFJ) via a newsy note postmarked Tehran, Iran (EP-land), which traveled over

11 and dale to reach Hill from Dale. Further comments are superfluous and only draw boos from readers anyway, so let's let Dale tell it:

First let me offer congratulations to everyone in the NCCC for what appears to be one super KB effort in the '75 SS. Got my JUG about a week ago ((Dale's letter written Jan. 9)) and Bill Snider (K6KM) and I really enjoyed looking over the scores. Sure wish we could have been a part of the effort!

Getting licensed here is truly one outstanding pain in the butt. Bill has had his application in now for about a month and he's fairly sure that absolutely nothing has been done with it. Don't even think it's reached the PTT folks yet. Since I'm just now going through the Residence Permit / Work Permit fiasco, I haven't even turned in my application yet. Copies of these permits must be included with the 19-page application, which is written mostly in Farsi. Maybe I will be able to turn it in next week when I get my permits.

Because of these troubles, Bill and I have cided to push hard to go on a DXpedition. are really shooting for the CQ WW CW test in November, so I've got about 15 Letters of Inquiry out to all the countries in this part of the world. Looks like we should be able to get licensed from Kuwait, and I've written W6RGG to see if he can give us a lead on his friend down there who has the big antennas. Jordan is also a pretty sure possibility.

One country that interests both Bill and me is Iran's neighbor to the immediate west: Iraq. Since YI is on almost everyone's Most Needed list, an operation from there would be a super coup. I'll be in Baghdad in about 3 weeks with my Field Engineer; we are about to appoint a distributor there. Sooooo ... I'm going to pursue getting a license through the Ministry of PTT. Looks like W7KW is also looking into this, so I've written him a letter, too.

If any of the guys know anything about getting licensed in any of the countries here, we would sure like to hear from them. This kind of information is in very short supply here, and almost anything in the way of someone's name, a telephone number, etc., would help.

Band condx here are fair to lousy; 40 seems to be the one with best worldwide propagation. There is a tremendous amount of broadcast and junk QRM there, though.

Pass my regards to all the NCCC gang -- I

hope we can get something together for one of the contests. I may be on Guernsey for the 2nd CW weekend of the ARRL DX Test. Have applied for my British license (hopefully GC5BOX, if my sweet-talkin' did any good), so may CU from there. 73! -- Dale, W6GEN/EP
