FD MOBILE NUMBER 1 - AGAIN

We strongly urge every club member who is excited about Field Day to participate in the paaresident's PAA portable 6 operation. The rates should be very high, the opportunity to pick up helpful domestic contest operating techniques (THINK SS '76) will be unprecedented, and the chance of having a great time should be around 99 & 44/100ths percent.

However, we would like to offer a club alternative for those who want more H.F. operating time and/or an opportunity to experience a "different" style of contesting. The NCCC is the defending club aggregate mobile champion (and record holder) and we'd fike to keep it that way!

What's different about mobile contesting? Well, you ain't got a big signal all of the time. You will start the contest searching and pouncing instead of calling CQ and the going may get rough for the first several hours. However, there will be times when you are a big signal. "You're 30 over 9 in Colorado and I don't believe you're mobile." Also, the reason Field Day is the King of all contests allowing mobile entries is that most portable entries are multi-transmitter. This means most stations will work out several bands at once instead of just one. When a band runs dry, the big sig is forced to search and pounce -- and this is when the mobile starts calling CQ. With a relatively weak signal, East coast runs are rare but if you can work every station west of the Rockies on 5 bands/both modes, you will have a very respectable score and QSO total.

"I'm gonna go with the PAA bunch, but this mobiling sounds like it might be a lot of fun." If this is what you're thinking, consider a compromise. Operate your regular stint at PAA/6, then drive a few miles down the road and put in a little mobile operating time. A two-mtr rig will net you 25-75 QSO's, and an H.F. rig will net a bit more. Nothing like contributing to two potential, national champions in the same contest!
