Murphy rampaged wildly and indiscriminantly, afflicting big guns, little guns, and medium guns alike. Some of those afflicted hung in there gamely; others didn't. Some relative contest neop tes set the bands on fire; some old pros didn't even make it on the bands, or else put in only token efforts. A decidedly mixed bag, this ARRL SS CW.

And where, in this kaleidoscope of rapid rates and missing multipliers, of blown linears and playing slopers, do NCCC's chances for a NATIONAL TITLE stand? Well, it definitely won't be the 15 Meg. walkover we confidently predicted at the Hayward October meeting. PVRC will not be blown right off the map into the Atlantic depths. Instead, NCCC must come through in the clutch on PHONE--or forever be known as that West Coast club that got lucky one year when PVRC let down through boredom with #1-itis.

Our true CW score(PAA was sandbagging on p. 1) is just a fraction under 5 Meg., gang. This is probably a new SS record. We made 4.3 Meg. on CW and 5.8 Meg. on phone last year(We lost ½ Meg. on disqualifications and failures to submit entries). That phone score was based on 7 fewer entries than the CW one. It seems pretty obvious that 12 Meg(should WIN it!) is within our reach-IF IF IF EVERYBODY shows his true mettle as a contester of repute for one lousy 24-hour period next weekend. SS #1: If you WANT it, here it is, come and get it. Can you hack it??

Last, but certainly not least, accolade-worthy are the stn/ops who broke through that magic 100K barrier: WB6AIN, K6AUC (+K6ILM), K6DC, WA6DIL, WA6DQM, W6JZU (WA6TLV), W6KQG, W6MSF (WB6LPK + WAØENP), W6MUR (K6ZX), WA6NGG, WA7NIN (W6OAT), W6OKK, W6PAA, K6PU (WB6CEP), K6QZ/6, WA6UZA/6 (+K6EBB), K6VVA, W6YX (M/O).

No Logs, No #1

While this topic has already been mentioned before, it is so important that w repeat it again. Mail in your logs! Either hand 'em over to your local AC (...ea Coordinator) or send 'em to ARRL yourself, but DO IT! We lost quite a few points because a number of people, mostly smaller entries, failed to do this last year. Since it may be close, please don't fail us in 1976.

If you elect to mail the logs yourself, a handy hint is to enclose a self-addressed stamped postcard containing the words "SS logs for (your callsign) have been received at ARRL)." The deadline is right after Christmas, but mail early so you have some recourse if the Post Office fouls up.

Before mailing the logs, carefully check for dupes (we lost several <u>hundred</u> thousand points last year on this one!) and make a xerox copy of <u>both</u> summary sheets to give to your AC. We need this copy to assure accurate <u>Club</u> records.

Some SS CW Soapbox

As this JUG is being put out in a super rush so you will have the scores before the Phone Weekend, only a limited number of stories have come to the attention of your scribe thus far. While we had a record number of entries (75), a bundle of Clean Sweeps (W6PAA, WA7NIN/OAT, W6JZU/TLV, W6YX/multi, W6BIP/+DJI, & W6UA), some significant improvements over last year (W6PAA, WA7NIN/OAT, K6PU/CEP, W6JZU/TLV, WB6AIN, WA6DIL, W6YX/multi, W6KQG, W6OKK, WA6MQS/VEF, W6BIP/+DJI, WA6BMV, K6AYA/+OEC, K6BR, K6ZM, K6QX, WA6JUD, W6KZJ, K6TG, and possibly others not yet accounted for), and a new SS CW Club record score, it could have been so much better had not Murphy struck repeatedly! Your phone call could stop history from repeating itself and clinch for us SS#1 #2.
