THAT TURNED OUT TO BECOME A NATIONAL WINNER ABD RESPECTED FORCE IN CONTEST-





UNJAMMING TAILTWISTERS

HAS YOUR TAILTWISTER EVER REFUSED TO TURN THE ANTENNA? IF SO, YOU ARE IN GOOD COMPANY. BASED ON MY EXPERIENCE WITH THREE DIFFERENT ROTATORS, AND THAT OF OTHERS AS WELL, I'VE CONCLUDED THAT SOME-TIMES THE SOLENOID IS UNABLE TO RETRACT THE BRAKE WEDGE. USUALLY IF I FLIP THE MOTOR SWITCH ONE WAY OR THE OTHER, THE WEDGE BREAKS FREE. THE FACTORY CONFIRMS THAT THE TAILTWISTER BRAKE WEDGE IS SH-APED DIFFERENTLY FOR MORE STRENGTH AND CAN "JAM" WHEN PRELOADED. TURNING THE MOTOR RELIEVES THE PRELOAD.

THIS MAY NOT WORK IF THE ROTATOR IS AT ONE OF THE LIMIT, BECAUSE THE SWITCHES INSIDE THE ROTATOR PREVENT TURNING FUR-THER INTO THE LIMIT. DON'T CLIMB THE TOWER YET! YOU CAN BYPASS THE SWITCHES BY JUMPERING TERMINALS AT THE BACK OF THE CONTROL BOX - 5 TO 8 FOR CLOCKWISE AND 4 TO 6 FOR COUNTERCLOCKWISE.

1981 NORTH AMERICAN SPRINT CONTEST CONDENSED RULES

- 1. OBJECT: TO WORK AS MANY STATIONS AND MULTIPLIERS AS POSSIBLE.
 NON-NORTH AMERICAN (NA) COUNTRIES DO NOT COUNT AS MULTIPLIERS.
- 2. Entry Classification: Single operator only. No spotting nets.
- 3. <u>CONTEST PERIOD</u>: 0100-0500 UCT, SEPT. 6, 1981 (SATURDAY NIGHT).
- 4. Mode: CW only. 5. Contacts: A station may be worked once on each band.
- 6. <u>Bands</u>: 20,40, and 80 meters. Suggested frequencies 14030-14050, 7030-7050, 3530-3550 KHz.
- 7. Exchange: Send the following~ His call, your call, serial number starting with 001, your name, your state.
- 8. VALID CONTACT: A TWO-WAY EXCHANGE BETWEEN A NA STATION AND ANOTHER STATION. LOG TIME OF EACH CONTACT.
- 9. NA STATION: AS DEFINED BY THE RULES OF THE CQWW DX CONTESTS.
- 10. <u>Scoring</u>: Multiply total valid contacts by sum of states, VE provinces, and other NA Countries. KH6 does not count as a state or country.
- 11. Special QSY Rule: If any station solicits a call by sending CQ, QRZ, etc., he is permitted to work only one station in response to that solicitation. He must thereafter move at least 1 KHz before he works another station, or at least 5 KHz before he solicits other calls.
- 12. Team Competition: Limited to a maximum of 10 operators as a single entry unit. The team must be registered with at least 24 hours before the start of the Sprint. Contact Rusty for complete details.
- 13. Awards: A trophy shall be awarded to the highest-scoring entrant.

 CERTIFICATES OF MERIT SHALL BE AWARDED TO THE HIGHEST SCORING ENTRANT FROM EACH USA CALL DISTRICT, CANADA AND OTHER COUNTRY; TO EACH OF THE TEN HIGHEST SCORING ENTRANTS; TO EACH MEMBER OF THE WINNING TEAM; AND TO THE HIGHEST SCORING ENTRANT ON EACH TEAM.
- 14. Reporting: Entries must be sent to Rusty Epps, W60AT, 948-H Kiely Blvd., Santa Clara, CA 95051 (ph.408-988-2900) and must be postmarked no later than October 7,1981 to be eligible for trophys and awards. An entry consists of (1) a summary sheet showing valid contacts by band, total multipliers, total score, name, callsign and address of operator, station callsign and station location. (2) A complete, legible log of all contacts (including dupes marked as such) with indication by numbered sequence of each multiplier claimed. (3) A separate check sheet for each band. Logs, summary sheets, and check sheets may be home made or patterned after those shown in the NCJ. Rusty has samples.


