

# 171 MEG--AND COUNTING

The upstarts from the West have done it again! With eleven CW scores still unknown (including some <u>real</u> good ones), NCCC stands at a conservative CW and SSB score estimate of 171 Megapoints. Again, to each of you who participated in the contest(s), congratulations for a job well done.

It appears that our East Coast rivals have also fared well. PVRC is not in the running, and FRC, last year's winner, is in at around 150 Meg. But, YCCC is claiming a CW and SSB total of somewhere between 178 and 185 Megapoints. Assuming that this score estimate is probably not as conservative as ours, and adding those missing CW efforts to our total, it's safe to say that we're tied with YCCC for the Club Competition title.

So, at this point, two things are very important. First, make sure that your log is duped and scored properly. With the Club scores being so close, the CQ Contest Committee will undoubtedly take a good look at each and every NCCC log. And if you do a sloppy job on your log, it'll probably be disqualified.

Second, be sure to mail your CW log before the January 15th, 1982, deadline. The address is:
