## What the Competition is Up To

As a rule, YCCC makes no effort to disguise our intentions, although there was some opinion that we should have done so last February (from both inside and outside the club). In any event, this column will report whatever we hear, substantiated or not, about the activities of other "unlimited" clubs. Our major sources are the club newsletters (we currently exchange with PVRC, FRC, NCCC and MM). and personal contacts.

The Northern California Contest Club (NCCC), has become bored by crushing the competition year after year in the ARRL. Sweepstakes. This year, they've decided to go after the CQ WW DX Contest. Some of you may feel that West Coast chances in a DX competition are nil, but we must take these guys seriously in view of their past performances. For the CQ WW, you don't need to stay home to make points for the club-expeditions count, and they make lots of points! NCCC's leadership has already laid out a number of candidate expeditions, complete with licensing and expense info.

The Potomac Valley Radio Club (PVRC) has been a strong SS club over the years, and intends to mount a special effort this year in view of the likely drop in NCCC score. For those with short memories, here's how the large clubs finished in SS over the last 10 years:

Well, here we go! It's the middle of September, and we're only 35 or so days away from the Northern Callfornia Contest Club's first attempt at the 1981 CQ World W1de DX Compet1tion. This promises to be the biggest and most participated-In contest that NCCC has ever done. Be sure to mark your calendar for these dates and $t$ mes:

> 3SB--0000Z October 24 to 0000 October 26
> CW--0000Z November 28 to $0000 Z$ November 30

Our Club goal for this yearts World Wide is 200 Megapoints--which is, frankly, a lot. But, there will also be a lot of NCCCers on for the contest. of the 182 members currently on our roster, 154 have told me that they will be active during one or both of the contest weekends. I've not yet contacted 17 members, and Just thirteen plan no CQWW activity. When one considers that the most members ever to participate in a Club effort was 114 (in the 1979 ARRL DX Test), it becomes apparent that NCCC is really interested in the CQ World W1de. There w1ll be at least 20 NCCC contest expeditions contributing to the Club total. As well, we'll be heavy on the homefront here in Northern California and Nevada. Between the two weekends, we'll have 33 multi-multi and multi-single full-blast efforts, and there'll be scores of single-operator, all-band entries. All in all, the enthusiasm for this contest seems to be nothing short of fantastic (and fanatic)!

Since this is our first CQWW, I'd like to give you a brief rundown on the contest rules. The obfect is to work as many different $D X$ stations in as many ilfferent countries and $C Q$ Magazine zones as possible. There are a total of 40 CQ zones. You may work your own country for zone and country oredit, but you get zero points for the QSO. You may also contact stations on more than one band; and in the US, Canada is considered a different country, so don't forget to work the VEs.

The score is determined by the following formula: Score $=$ Total QSO Points $x$ ( \# of Different Band Countries + \# of Different Band CQ Zones). As for Total QSO Points, if you operate from anywhere in North America, you get three points for each QSO outside of your continent, and two points for all within-continent contacts. As previously mentioned, you receive zero QSO points for working your own country. For our DXpeditions outside of North America, scoring is three points for out-of-continent QSOs, and one point for in-continent ones. Again, working your own country merits zero QSO talles. If all of this seems unclear, you can find complete rules in the September 181 issue of CQ Magazine. Or, send me a postcard or call me $(415-538-0520)$ and $I+11$ send you a cony of the rules.

In addition, on each mode, there $w 111$ be awards for the station owner and operator( $B$ ) of the high scoring in-territory unlimited mult1-mult1; two-tranmitter mult1-multi; multi-single; and single-op, allband. The Club will also be giving out awards for our contest expeditions. Look for more information on our CQWW awards program in next month's Searet Insert.

Back in 1975, our Club achleved what was then the greatest "come-from-nowhere" victory in radio contest history when we won the ARRL Novenber Sweepstakes.
