## MEETING OF MAY 24, 1982

NGQW opened the meeting by reading the minutes of the last meeting. They WERE APPROVED AS READ. DENNIS HAS NOW COMPLETED HIS LAST DUTY AS THE 1981/82 SECRETARY/TREASURER.

UNDER OLD BUSINESS, PROSPECTS FOR THE WPX CW CONTEST AS REPORTED BY SEVERAL MEMBERS DID NOT SOUND VERY PROMISING WITH CONDITIONS BEING SO POOR. NORO REP-ORTED NOT HAVING BEEN IN A CONTEST FOR THE LAST SIX WEEKS. SO CONDITIONS MUST REALLY BE BAD!

ARMED FORCES DAY ACTIVITIES WERE REPORTED BY K6CSL WHO SAID THAT N6BT. WAGVEF, AA4KB, KN6M, KR6P, AND KGCSL OPERATED AT NPG AND ABOUT 1450 QSO'S WERE MADE IN SPITE OF SOME TRANSMITTERS BEING DOWN FOR SEVERAL HOURS AT A TIME.

K6XO REPORTED THAT A REPLACEMENT FOR HIMSELF ON THE CAC HAS NOT YET BEEN APPOINTED BY DIVISION DIRECTOR, W6ZM, SO HE WILL REMAIN ON CAC FOR THE PRESENT.

Under new business, President W6SZN brought up the proposed 20M band phone EXPANSION SUGGESTIONS AND AFTER CONSIDERABLE DISCUSSION ON THE VARIOUS ALTER-NATIVES, IT WAS VOTED UNANIMOUSLY IN FAVOR OF THE PROPOSED ARRL IDEAS INCLUDING NO SPLIT-BAND PROVISIONS.

NGRO WAS APPOINTED TO HEAD A SUB-COMMITTEE FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING A GUIDELING FOR THE CONTEST CLUB CODE OF ETHICS.

THE RAFFLE WAS HELD AS A BREAK IN THE MEETING WHILE THE GUEST SPEAKERS KOHNZ. NGKT AND NGRO COORDINATED THEIR TALKS. \$24 WERE TAKEN IN AND KGCSL, NGBT AND A MYSTERY MEMBER WON THE PRIZES WHICH WERE ALL NEW PUBLICATIONS ON ANTENNAS. 80 METER DXING, AND AN ANTENNA ANTHOLOGY.

THE TALKS ON CONTESTING TIPS GAVE MANY GOOD IDEAS ON IMPROVING OUR CONTEST SCORES. SOME OF THOSE WERE: SELECT A GOAL FOR YOURSELF AND GO FOR IT; PREPAR-ATION IS VERY IMPORTANT, LOOK AT LAST YEAR'S RESULTS AND CHECK CONDITIONS A WEEK OR SO IN ADVANCE; USE A "DX EDGE" FOR GRAY LINE TIMES; CHECK OPENINGS ON 10 AND 80 METERS; DO NOT MISS THE FIRST HOUR OF ANY CONTEST; NEW WAND JA PREFIXES FOR WPX; 80 AND 40M LONGPATH OPENINGS; THE LARGEST NUMBER OF MULTI-PLIERS IS MADE BY CALLING CQ.

THE MEETING WAS ADJOURNED AT 9:45 PM.

IF THERE ARE NO ENTRIES, WE WILL GO AHEAD WITH PRESENT PLANS FOR MEETING PROGRAMS, WHICH BEGIN WITH "NOKB ON OPERATING WITH LINE NOISE" ( IN SIX INSTALL-MENTS).

#### MINUTES OF, NCCC BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING JUNE 3, 1982

The meeting was held at the hilltop home of KN6M in Orinda. Those who attended were AA6G, KN6M, K6ZM, N6XI, W6SZN and WA6VEF. President Kip opened the meeting by presenting the proposed budget for 1982/83. After discussions of income and expense, the budget was unanimously accepted by the BoD.

KN6M suggested one or two line advertisments of member's business specialties at \$3 an issue or \$30 per year as another source of club income. Also, he will handle the raffle at the N6RO picnic. AA6G will run the June meeting raffle.

There is a need for guest speakers at the meetings and it was hoped that a story in the June JUG will bring in some good suggestions. Kip will write the story (see elsewhere this issue).

New ideas for several annual activities were introduced and discussed by W6SZN hopefully to increase participation in these various events. He gave out some new ideas for the Christmas party that should make it more attractive to the female guests. Possibly a hotel with dancing after dinner and a very short awards program would do it. Also, small gifts could be exchanged. Any suggestions?

President Kip requested that a job description of each elective office in the NCCC be made available before elections so that the duties of each officer would be clearly understood by all prospective club officers.

IT WAS DECIDED BY THE BOD THAT DUES COLLECTION WILL BE MADE MORE BUSINESS-LIKE BY SENDING OUT AN INVOICE TO EACH MEMBER. AA4KB WILL BE ASKED TO GENERATE AN APPROPRIATE FORM ON HIS COMPUTER.

THE SUNNYVALE OLYMPICS NEED MORE ADVANCE PUBLICITY WITH A SCHEDULE FOR THE PICNIC EVENTS AND WITH BEER SUPPLIED BY NCCC. AAGG WILL ASK WB6SHD IF HE WILL MAKE THE ARRANGEMENTS AGAIN THIS YEAR AS HE HAS DONE SO WELL IN THE PAST.

WA6VEF proposed a Contest Club Reunion Contest on 80M and 40M, the exchange to be name and first year of club membership. This could be either a pre-contest warm up or an activity between contests.

KIP ANNOUNCED THAT KAGING, AWARDS CHAIRMAN, HAS A NUMBER OF UNCLAIMED TROPHY AWARDS AND CERTIFICATES. THESE WILL BE LISTED IN THE JUNE JUG. ALSO, HE STATED THAT THE SANTA CRUZ AMATEUR RADIO CLUB WILL HOST THE 1982 PACIFIC DIVISION CONVENTION IN SANTA CRUZ ON OCT.8,9,10 AND HAVE INVITED NOBT TO MC THE CONTEST FORUM.

THE MEETING WAS ADJOURNED AT 9:45 PM.

## TS-830S Mods

#### **CW Offset**

#### Tom Frenaye, K1KI

Here's how to change the TS-830 cw offset from 800 Hz to your preferred offset:

- Remove the four hex bolts around the tuning knob on the front panel.
- Slowly pull the VFO assembly out of the cabinet (the cables may make it difficult to ease it out, but it is possible). There is no need to disconnect the cables from the VFO, although it makes things a little easier.
- Remove the five screws holding the shield onto the VFO.
- 4. Remove L2 (1 uH) from the VFO board (it should be clearly marked).
- 5. Rewind L2 with about seven more turns of #34 magnet wire as closely spaced as possible. (My L2 had 23 turns so I wound 30 turns onto the coil form.) This will reduce the offset to somewhere between 500 and 600 Hz. You can add or subtract turns to vary the frequency as you prefer (compare the rx and tx frequencies to hear the offset). A dab of glue on the coil after winding will keep things in order.
- 6. While you have the VFO out of the radio (and after you have put the shield back on), take the time to align the analog dial with the digital readout. Remove the tuning knob, loosen the nut on the tuning shaft and retighten.

That is it...total elapsed time should be about one hour, even for klutzes like me. Thanks to K1JX for figuring out what to change and for the inspiration to try it.

Tom, N4KG, measured the following offset frequencies vs standard inductor values for the K1KI/K1JX TS-830 cw offset mod. (**Butt** 38):  $1.3~\mu h = 800~Hz$ ,  $1.5~\mu h = 600~Hz$ ,  $1.7~\mu h = 500~Hz$ ,  $2.2~\mu h = 400~Hz$ .




