Announcements of the candidacy of W6RGG and W6SZN for Pacific Division Director and Vice-Director were made, as well as the FIRST PLACE finish of N6KT at AI6V in the 1983 ARRL DX Test SSB (congratulations!).

K6RK, K6XN, K4WJT, and KE6PQ were elected/welcomed to membership.

We were treated to an expert and entertaining presentation by Cam Pierce of his 1982 visit to Niue and other Pacific points, with many items of interest to both hams and non-hams,

The dinner and fellowship were enjoyed by all. Thanks to Cam for the fine entertainment and dinner arrangements. (Thanks also to N6QW and WA6WEQ for their help with the raffle and accounting).

Minutes -- NCCC Board of Directors Meeting -- October, 1983

The meeting was held on 10/10 at K6KLY and attended by K6KLY, K6HNZ, KC6D, N6TV, K6XO, K6TMB, K6RU, W6SZN, and N6KT.

Programs and arrangements for the October membership meeting and the Christmas banquet were developed (see elsewhere in this JUG).

Membership awards for CQWW participation were discussed and proposed to be awarded similarly to last year's.

Preliminary CQP results were reported (see elsewhere).

CQWW planning was continued, with emphasis on staffing of local-area stations. It was decided that K6HNZ will collect and tally CQWW scores and summary sheets.

The club treasury stands at \$2468.06, including \$313.20 in the repeater fund. Roster printing and mailing costs were approximately \$120, and a small profit resulted from the dinner/raffle. Paid club membership now stands at over 150 members (KB!!)

The next Board meeting will be at W6SZN on November 10.

This lineup should be just as productive and competitive as the 1981 DXpeditions that helped us win the club championship. What is needed to win this years championship is an effort by the home stations equal to that in 1981. We still have some work to do matching stations and operators and things are shaping up very well. Some new multi's will be on this year and we should give YCCC and FRC a real run for the top spot.

IF YOU ARE NOT SET WITH A PLACE TO OPERATE CALL NOTV, KOKLY, KOTMB OR MY-SELF. WE WILL HELP YOU FIND A SUITABLE STATION. BUT DON'T WAIT. DO IT NOW! I THINK WE CAN WIN THIS THING AND YOU SHOULD ALL BE IN ON THE VICTORY. REM-EMBER THE SMALL WINNING MARGIN IN 1981. EVERY POINT WE CAN GET IS NEEDED.

THE SUNSPOT NUMBERS ARE DECREASING AND SO IS OUR HIGH BAND PROPAGATION.

IT LOOKS LIKE 10 METERS MAY BE GOOD THIS YEAR, BUT THEN 10 AND EVEN 15 METERS WILL FADE AWAY FOR FOUR OR FIVE YEARS. SO DON'T MISS THIS LAST OPPORTUNITY FOR A REAL INTERESTING DX CONTEST AND THE CHANCE TO PILE UP A BIG SCORE.

THE AWARDS FOR THIS YEAR ARE ALMOST IDENTICAL TO THOSE FOR LAST YEAR. PLAQUES WILL BE AWARDED TO THE STATION OWNER FOR THE HIGH SCORE (TO THE CLUB) IN EACH OF THE FOLLOWING CATEGORIES ON EACH MODE:

2 XMTR MULTI/MULTI
UNLIMITED MULTI/MULTI

Domestic " SINGLE OPERATOR MULTI-SINGLE MULTI/MULTI DXPEDITION

For the DXpedition Nulti/Single and Multi/Multi categories, <u>all</u> club member operators will reveive plaques.

ALL NON-WINNER DXPEDITIONS OPERATORS WILL BE PRESENTED APPRECIATION AWARDS. PROBABLY THE POPULAR PAPERWEIGHTS.

OPERATOR AWARDS, PROBABLY THE PAPERWEIGHTS, WILL BEPRESENTED TO THE OPERATORS OF THE WINNING STATION IN EACH DOMESTIC CATEGORY, EXCLUDING THE STATION OWNER.

CERTIFICATES WILL BE AWARDED TO ALL MEMBERS WHO ACHIEVE 500,000 POINTS ON A SINGLE MODE OR 750,000 POINTS COMBINED BOTH MODES. THE POINTS EARNED BY OPERATORS OF MULTI OPERATOR STATIONS WILL BE THE STATION SCORE DIVIDED BY THE TOTAL NUMBER OF OPERATORS.

The 2 meter DX spotting net will be in operation the full 48 hour period. If a single operator uses the net he becomes a Multi/Single by CQ Magazine rules, but is still a single operator by NCCC rules. It is a lot of fun and will add many multipliers to your score. The net will be carried on W6TI/R, 147.96/36, the NCDXC repeater. If Jamming becomes a problem try the NCCC repeater on 147.84/24. In this contest we are competing against the East Coast and not against each other. So please call in every possible multiplier. Louese, KA6ING, is organizing the SSB 2 meter net. If you can take a 2 hour net control stint, please call her at 415)583-5333. Please give her your assistance.

FOR THOSE WHO ARE NEW TO OUR NET OPERATION EVERY QUARTER HOUR EXACTLY THE NET CONTROL STATION WILL LIST BY BAND ALL THE DX STATIONS REPORTED DURING THE PREVIOUS 15 MINUTES. SYNCHRONIZE YOUR CLOCKS WITH WWV. REPORT DX STATIONS INTO THE NET BY BAND, CALL, FREQUENCY AND YOUR CALL IN THAT ORDER.




