

MINUTES

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING November 3, 1987

The meeting held at the QTH of VE2AQS was called to order at 20 hours local time. The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting held at W6OAT was done and were accepted unanimously.

Attendees were as follows: W6RGG, NV6Z, WA6VEF, VE2AQS and K6ZM.

The Christmas menu was discussed at length and it was agreed to choose the Pacific Snapper and the Roast Sirloin of Beef as the two choices. Cost per person will be \$17.50, including tax and gratuity.

Gary, WA6VEF, was elected to contact N6BT to act as the Master of Ceremony.

It was agreed that election night will take place on April 29, 1988. The place will be decided at the next board meeting.

The Award dinner will be held at the Pleasanton Hotel on March 18 or 19, depending on the banquet room availability.

The January meeting is to take place on the 22nd in a restaurant near the Redwood City area. NV6Z and W6OAT will find a place in that area. WA6VEF will ask AI6V for the possiblity of having during this meeting a presentation of the P40V DXpedition.

The following meeting will be held on February 26 in the Los Altos area.

Unanimously it was agreed that the California Counties Award effective date will be October 1, 1987. The rules are being prepared by K6ZM and will be published shortly.

The meeting was adjourned at 23.00 PM local time.

LETTERS TO EDITOR

November 15, 1987

I am writing in response to the letters that were published in the past Jugs and were written by Rusty (W6OAT), a follow-up by Bruce (W6OSP) and also a follow-up by Lyle (WW6F). It is my understanding that Rusty's original letter was merely food-for-thought and not necessarily the opinion of the

author. However, like Lyle, this would leave me out of the NCCC by virtue of geographic location, not being able to attend social functions, etc. Unlike Lyle, I am personally offended by this idea or suggestion.

Rusty's letter said to keep the club small would be a good way to go. I feel, however, that do do such a thing would be the destruction of the NCCC. I feel that if you are going to stay alive you have to gain in membership and grow and not go the other way.

I do not feel that we need to have any sort of prerequisite to become a member, simply because someone who is not interested in contesting would not wish to become a member anyway. As far as a certain amount of contest participation to stay a member is concerned, why do we care? If people who are not participating are still paying dues, then that leaves the club more money to spend on awards programs, etc. Also, these people just might decide to participate when we do need them for a big "push" once in a while such as trying to beat the East Coast club in the CQWW.

I submit to the NCCC membership the following for your consideration:

- 1. That we divide the club into chapters; e.g., the Sacramento Valley Chapter could include everything from Vallejo to Roseville, west to Napa and east to Stockton. We could also have a San Joaquin Valley Chapter, a Santa Rosa Chapter, etc. Each one of these chapters could set up their own meeting schedules and have a get-together with the entire NCCC two or three times a year. Fox example, the awards banquet, Christmas, etc.
- 2. We could have each of these chapters competing against each other in various contests. However, this would have to be only the single-operator or single transmitter multi-operator stations to combine that chapter's score. The multi-multi stations would have to enter just as a whole score to the NCCC and could compete against each other. Of course, all scores would go to the NCCC for one club entry. We would still have this competition between chapters.

I feel that this would do several things. It would generate more interest within the club. It would prevent a lot of commuting to go to meetings, and it would also make the club prosper and grow and would gain membership on local levels within those chapters.


