

# **ALL ASIAN CONTEST**

The CW part takes place **June 19-20, 2021**

**The exchange is age.  $YL = 00$  However, there is no problem with choosing any age, just don't change it during the contest.**

**If Multi op, you can take the average age or choose any age.**

**The multipliers are different Asian prefixes/band.  
JA1, JF9 and UW0 would be three multipliers.  
You can work the same multipliers on any other  
band.**

**The vast majority of QSOs, as you might guess, are in Japan followed by China and Asiatic Russia.**

There are **150 pxs available in Japan + JD + special event stations with 8J and 8N prefixes. Except for JA/ JH and JR, which are issued in all call areas.**

as of today, there are **NO prefixes issued alphabetically above the following:**

**JO4, JJ5, JQ7, JO8, JF9, JJ0.** 7J prefixes =

foreigners in Japan 8J and 8N are special event

prefixes. **Note: There are also 7K1-4, 7L1-4, 7M1-4 and 7N1-4**

**Asiatic Russia:** The first letter of the suffix tells you where the Asiatic Russian station is located and **how well the band is open.**

Here is a list of identifying suffixes.

The prefix # can be 8/9 or 0 and anything starting with a R or U...e.g. RI8U, RL0A, RD0A, UA9M etc...

R8/9 H, I, O, U, V, Y and Z = **zone 18**

R8/9 A, B, C, D, F, G, J, K, L, M, N, Q, R, P = **zone 17**

R8/9 S, T, W, X = **zone 16**

R0 A, O, R, S, T, U, V, W = **zone 18**

R0 C, D, E, F, I, J, K, L, M, N, Q, X, Z = **zone 19**

R0 Y = **zone 23**

**Chinese call areas** and suffixes tell you where the station is located The **PRC** pxs usually seen are BA, BD, BG, BH, BI, BL, BY 1-0, **Taiwan:** BM, BN, BO, BP, BQ, BU, BV, BW, BX 1-0

BY1, 2, BY3 **all except G-L**, BY4-8 = **zone 24**  
**BY3G-L**, BY9, BY0 = **zone 23**

Without working a JT, you can log a zone 23 with BY9, BY0 and BY3G-L. Several BY stations have been very active from zone 23.

The following slides provide information on **band openings**. **Each hour is a total for two years, both days**, i.e. any hour number = the total of 4 days over two years for K3EST MM. The openings show what was possible for a big station; however **the peak hours are when any station can work Asians**.
